ORDER (ORAL)

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24.05.2019

1. Having heard learned counsel, I am of the opinion that this writ petition can be disposed of, at this stage, without subjecting it to the regour of completion of pleadings etc.
2. A show cause notice was issued, on 5th January, 2017, to the petitioner, by the Western Regional Committee (WRC) of the National Counsel for Teachers Education (NCTE), proposing to withdraw the recognition, earlier granted to the petitioner, for conducting its M.Ed course.
3. On the ground that the petitioner had defaulted in replying to

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the show cause notice, the WRC *vide* its order dated 12th April, 2018, withdrew the recognition granted to the petitioner.

4. The petitioner appealed, thereagainst, to the Appellate Committee in the NCTE. The appeal was allowed *vide* order dated 7th August, 2018.

5. Before the Appellate Committee, the petitioner had pointed out that it had submitted its reply to the show cause notice dated, 5th January, 2017 (*supra*), *vide* its letter dated 21st January, 2017, addressed to the WRC. It also annexed that the tracking report of the said reply, which verified that the reply to the show cause notice stood delivered to the WRC, on 23rd January, 2019. It was further pointed out that copies of all relevant documents, supporting the reply to the show cause notice, were also submitted, by the petitioner, to the WRC, on 24th March, 2018, which also stood diarised in the file of the WRC on 26th March, 2018.

6. In view thereof, the Appellate Committee, observing that the petitioner had been “able to establish, before issue of the impugned order, that reason for withdrawal, i.e. non-reply to the show cause notice dated 5th January, 2017, (*supra*), did not exist”, held that the WRC ought not to have withdrawn the recognition granted to the petitioner without thoroughly considering the case. Inasmuch as the only ground for withdrawing the recognition, granted to the petitioner, was the alleged non-submission, by it, of reply to the show cause notice, dated 5th January, 2017, (*supra*), the Appellate Committee



deemed it appropriate to remand the matter to the WRC for considering the reply dated 21st January, 2017 (*supra*), submitted by the petitioner in response to the show cause notice.

7. The matter is, presently, pending before the WRC, consequent to the order dated 7th August, 2018, (*supra*) of the Appellate Committee in the NCTE.

8. The grievance of the petitioner is that the NCTE is not reflecting the petitioner's status on its website for conducting of the M.Ed course during the academic year 2019-20.

9. It is obvious that, inasmuch as the order dated 12th April, 2018, passed by the WRC, withdrawing the petitioner's recognition, stands set aside by the Appellate Committee in the NCTE *vide* its order dated 7th August, 2018, the petitioner cannot be treated as an institution whose recognition stands withdrawn. It would, therefore, be entitled to be treated as a "recognized" institution.

10. Needless to say, this would be subject to the decision of the WRC in the proceedings which are presently pending before it.

11. Accordingly, till the WRC takes a decision on the proceeding pending before it, the respondent is directed to reflect the petitioner's status, on its website in respect of the M.Ed course for the academic year 2019-20, as "recognised".



12. The petitioner would also be entitled to participate in the counselling for the said course, which is presently stated to be underway.

13. The writ petition is allowed in the above terms with no order as to costs.
