Decision of WRC:

On careful perusal of the original file of the institution and other related documents, and having considered the same in terms of the NCTE Act, 1993, Rules and Regulations issued by NCTE from time to time, the directions of the Hon'ble Court, the Committee observed as under:

- (i) The recognition was granted to the institution, namely, “Jai Ganesh Educational Foundation” Sr.No.64, Indraprasth Krantinagar, Wadagaon(BK), Sinagadh Road, Pune-411041 Maharashtra for B.Ed. (M) (CO-ED) course vide order No.WRC/5-6/103rd/2008/34680-85 dated 16.05.2008 with an annual intake of 100 students.
- (ii) After promulgation of NCTE Regulation, 2014, the revised recognition order was issued to the institution vide order no. WRC/APW04503/123547/2015/145478-501 dated 31.05.2015 for B.Ed. Programme with an annual intake of 100 students (two basic units of 50 Students) from the academic session 2015-2016.
- (iii) The matter regarding compliance by the institutions of the conditions of the revised recognition order was placed in the 255th WRC Meeting held on June 22-24, 2016 and the Committee decided that show cause notice be issued to all such institutions which have not submitted compliance. Accordingly, show cause notice issued to the institution on 13.12.2016.
- (iv) The matter was placed in the 380th WRC Meeting held on 10th February, 2023 and the Committee has decided to issue final show cause notice. Thereafter, again a final Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution on 12.04.2024.
- (v) The matter was placed in its 403rd Meeting held on 02nd & 03rd May, 2024, and the Committee has decided *that a letter be issued to the institution seeking a reply to final show cause notice as well as Email dated 02.03.2017 along with the copy of show cause notice dated 13.12.2016*

issued by WRCNCTE within 15 days from the date of issue of letter.

- (vi) The matter was placed in its 405th Meeting held on 03rd July 2024 and the Committee decided ***recognition for B.Ed. course be withdrawn u/s 17 of NCTE Act, 1993 with effect from the end of the academic session next following the date of communication of withdrawal order. Accordingly, Withdrawal Order dated 13.08.2024 issued to the institution.***
- (vii) The institution preferred an appeal under section 18 of NCTE Act 1993 against the WRC Withdrawal Order dated 13.08.2024.
- (viii) The institution filed an Appeal against the Withdrawal Order dated 13.08.2024 and the Appeal Committee vide order dated 16.12.2024 remanded back the matter to WRC.
- (ix) The WRC in its 430th meeting held on 17-18 July, 2025 considered the matter and had decided to issue **Show Cause Notice** to the institution with a request to submit its reply within 15 days.
- (x) However, the Institution filed W.P.(C) 4499/2026 in the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, and the Hon'ble court vide its order dated 07.04.2026, issued the following directions:

"...8. Let WRC take a fresh decision and communicate the same to the petitioner.

9. The WRC is directed to issue an order of restoration of recognition within a period of two weeks from today, which will govern the rights and contentions of the parties, unless fresh withdrawal order is passed by the WRC.

10. The petitioner will be permitted to participate in the counselling and admit students for the academic session 2026-27, till the time a fresh withdrawal order is passed against it.

11. The status of petitioner as a recognized institution will also be reflected on the official website of respondents/NCTE and will be communicated by the NCTE to petitioner's affiliating body as well as to the concerned department of the State Government."

In view of the above, the Committee decided that in accordance with the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, vide its order dated 07.04.2026, the recognition for the B.Ed. course is restored with an annual intake of 100 students (two units of 50 students each).

The restoration order shall be displayed on the NCTE website, with the institution's status updated in the list of recognized institutions. The order shall also be forwarded to the affiliating body, State Government, and all concerned authorities for compliance.

Decision of WRC:

On careful perusal of the original file of the institution and other related documents, and having considered the same in terms of the NCTE Act, 1993, Rules and Regulations issued by NCTE from time to time, the directions of the Hon'ble Court, the Committee observed as under:

- (i) The recognition was granted to the institution, namely, "Janata Shikshan Prasarak Mandal's Women B.ed. College Opp. R.T.O Jahagirgar Colony, Railway Station, Aurangabad, Maharashtra-431005 course vide order No.WRC/5-6/103rd/2008/34680-85 dated 16.05.2008 with an annual intake of **100** students.
- (ii) After promulgation of NCTE Regulation, 2014 the revised recognition order was issued to the institution vide order no.WRC/APW00843/123177/2015 dated 19.08.2015 for B.Ed. Programme with an annual intake of 100 students (two basic units of 50 Students each) from the academic session 2015-2016.
- (iii) The matter regarding compliance by the institutions of the conditions of the revised recognition order was placed in the 255th WRC meeting held on June 22-24, 2016 and the Committee decided that show cause notice be issued to all such institutions which have not submitted compliance. Accordingly, show cause notice issued to the institution on 02.01.2017.
- (iv) The matter was placed in the 316th WRC meeting held on 27th to 28th August, 2020 & 04 September 2020. The WRC considered the entire issue in detail and decided that Show Cause Notice u/s 17 of the NCTE Act be issued to reply within 30 days to all such Institutions which have been permitted or given recognition/permission to run the programme in rented premises and have not yet applied for shifting of their institution accordingly show cause notice dated 09.10.2020 has been issued to the institution.
- (v) The matter was placed in 321st& 322nd meeting held on 09th to 11th November, 2020 & 23rd to 24th November 2020. The Committee decided that the recognition of B.Ed. programme of the institution be WITHDRAWN under clause 7(15) from the next academic session 2021-21. Accordingly, withdrawal order dated 19.12.2020 was issued to the institution.
- (vi) The institution had filed an appeal before the NCTE Headquarters against the withdrawal order dated 19.12.2020. Subsequently, the Appeal Committee, vide its order dated 30.06.2021, remanded the matter back to WRC, NCTE.

(vii) The matter was considered by the WRC in its meetings time to time and show cause notice dated 13.05.2022 was issued to the institution.

(viii) The Institution filed W.P. No.4311/2022 in the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay at Aurangabad and the Hon'ble Court had passed an order dated 23.09.2022. The operative part of the order is as under:-

"2. This matter was heard for some time. The learned Advocate for the petitioner submits that, the order is passed by respondent No.3. dated 30/06/2021, directing respondent No.2. to initiate appropriate action, after considering the entire record comprising of memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents on record and decide the issue within 15 days. Respondent No.2, despite receiving the order dated 30.06.2021. has still not decided the issue pertaining to withdrawal of recognition, which order was said to have been passed without hearing the petitioner.

3. The learned Advocate representing respondent Nos.2 and 3 submits on instructions that, respondent no.2 would decide the pending remanded proceedings. on or before 21/10/2022, keeping in view that, pursuant to the show cause notice, the petitioner has already tendered a reply and the pleadings are complete.

4. In view of the above, this petition is disposed off, with a direction to respondent No.2, to decide the said proceedings, on or before 21/10/2022, on it's own merits."

(ix) The matter was considered in 374th (Part-1) WRC Meeting held on 18th & 19th October 2022, wherein Committee decided "...In view of the above, the Committee decided to withdraw the recognition under Section 17(1) of the NCTE Act, 1993 for B.Ed. programme with effect from the end of the academic session next following the date of communication of the said order". Accordingly, Withdrawal Order vide No. F.No. WRC/APW00843/123177/374th /2022 was issued to the institution on 14.11.2022.

(x) The institution filed an appeal before the Appellate Authority which was disposed vide Order No. 89-70-E-1773771/2021/Appeal/12th Meeting, 2024 APPLWRC202414772 dated: 30.10.2024 as under:

"After perusal of the Appeal Report, documents on record and oral arguments advanced during the online hearing, Appeal Committee of the Council concluded that the WRC was justified in withdrawing the recognition and decided that the instant appeal deserves to be rejected and therefore, the impugned withdrawal order dated 14.11.2022 issued by WRC is confirmed."

(xi) The institution filed W.P. No. 10295/2025, CM APPL.42715/2025 & 53812/2025 before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi at New Delhi Passed an order dated: 16.09.2025 with the following direction:

"...16 Consequently, the petition is allowed. The impugned withdrawal order dated 14.11.2022, as well as the impugned order dated 13.10.2024 of the

appellate committee, are set aside, and the following directions are passed:

- (i) the matter is remanded to the respondent no.2-WRC to pass a fresh order on the basis of inspection;*
- (ii) in the event any deficiencies are pointed out in the recommendations, NCTE will grant reasonable time to the petitioner institution to rectify the same; and*
- (iii) if no deficiencies are recommended, or in case deficiencies recommended by NCTE are rectified by petitioner institution during the time period granted to it, the WRC will restore the recognition of petitioner institution for B.Ed. course (two basic units-100 seats), and consequently, the NCTE shall communicate about the restoration order to the affiliating university of the petitioner institution, as well as, to the State Government. Further, NCTE will also do the needful with regard to updation of the status of petitioner institution on its website.*

17. The petition along with pending applications, is disposed of in the aforesaid terms.

18. The date already fixed i.e. 27.10.2025 stands cancelled.”

- (xii) The above court matter was considered by WRC in its 443rd meeting(Part-I) held on 18-20 December, 2025 and Committee has decided as under:-

“The Committee noted the direction of Hon'ble Court and decided that Visiting Team be constituted for inspection of the institution under Section 13 of NCTE Act 1993 in order to ascertain and scrutinize all the essential documents and at the time of verification, VT shall also check/verify all building and land related documents, NEC, CLU, Mutation Certificate, Building Plan, Building Completion Certificate, Building Safety Certificate, Fire Safety Certificate, List of Teaching staff approved by the Affiliating body and payment of salary as per NCTE norms, Not-for-Profit certificate and website so as to assess institution's preparedness for running the B.Ed. course as per provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 as amended from time to time.”

- (xiii) As per the decision of WRC, an email was sent to the institution on 12th February 2026 with a request to fill up the proforma and submit it to WRC for conduct of VT as per the court order immediately.
- (xiv) The institution vide their reply mail dated 23rd February, 2026 and 25th February, 2026 instead of furnishing the requisite information requested WRC to restore the recognition of Janata Shikshan Prasarak Mandal's B.Ed. college, Khuladabad.
- (xv) In the meantime, the institution has approached Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide CM APPL 21898-2026 and the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide its order

dated 10.04.2026, has directed as under:-

“...7. In view of the above, para 16 of the judgment dated 16.09.2025 is modified/corrected to read as under:

“16. Consequently, the petition is allowed. The impugned withdrawal order dated 14.11.2022, as well as, the impugned order dated 13.10.2024 of the appellate committee, are set aside, and the following directions are passed:-

- i. The matter is remanded to the respondent no.2-WRC;*
- ii. The WRC will restore the recognition of petitioner institution for B.Ed. course (two basic units-100 seats) and consequently, the NCTE/WRC shall communicate about the restoration order to the affiliating university of the petitioner institution, as well as, to the State Government. Further, NCTE/WRC will also do the needful with regard to updation of the status or petitioner institution on its website.*
- iii. The NCTE is directed to carry out fresh inspection under Section 13 of NCTE Act and inform the petitioner institution about recommendations, if any, on the basis of such inspection; iv. In the event any deficiencies are pointed out in the recommendations, NCTE will grant reasonable time to the petitioner institution to rectify the same; and*
- iv. If no deficiencies are recommended, or in case deficiencies recommended by NCTE are rectified by petitioner institution during the time period granted to it, the restoration order will continue and in case deficiencies are not rectified, it will be open to WRC to initiate action under Section 17 of the Act in accordance with law.”*

8. The application stands disposed of in the above terms”

In view of the above, the Committee decided that in accordance with the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, vide its order dated 10.04.2026, the recognition for the B.Ed. course is restored with an annual intake of 100 students (two units of 50 students each).

The restoration order shall be displayed on the NCTE website, with the institution's status updated in the list of recognized institutions. The order shall also be forwarded to the affiliating body, State Government and all concerned authorities for compliance.

Decision of WRC:

On careful perusal of the original file of the institution and other related documents, and having considered the same in terms of the NCTE Act, 1993, Rules and Regulations issued by NCTE from time to time, the directions of the Hon'ble Court, and the documents submitted by the institution

pursuant to the communications issued by the WRC office in accordance with the minutes of the 453rd Meeting (Part-II), the Committee observed as under::

The institution filed a Writ Petition in the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi at New Delhi, and the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in W.P. No. 1207/2026 vide Order dated 29.01.2026 has passed the following decision: -

1. *“This is a writ petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking directions to the respondent No.2 to consider and decide the pending application of the petitioner institution regarding shifting of its premises.*
2. *Mr. Srivastava, learned counsel for the petitioner, states that the case the address of the petitioner college is Basant Parisar, Mayur Market, Gandhi Road, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh- 474011 and the petitioner wishes to change the address to Village Sirkoda (Badori), Jhansi Road, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh- 475001. The application of the petitioner is pending for the last many years.*
3. *For the said reasons, issue notice.*
4. *Ms. Malhotra, learned counsel accepts notice on behalf of the respondents.*
5. *It is directed that the respondent shall consider the application of the petitioner for change of its address as mentioned above expeditiously and in any case, within 6 weeks from today.*
6. *Needless to say, in case the petitioner is aggrieved, the petitioner will be at liberty to avail of its legal rights in accordance with law.*
7. *The petition is disposed of in the aforesaid terms.”*

2. The WRC further noted that, vide its letter submitted in November 2006 along with an affidavit, the institution had intimated that it had shifted to new premises located at RSC College, Plot No. 117, Khasra No. 117, Village/Town/City – Sikroda (Badori), Jhansi Road, District Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh. However, as per the provisions of the NCTE Regulations, any institution intending to shift its premises is required to submit a formal application along with the prescribed documents to the concerned Regional Committee. Such shifting can be effected only after obtaining prior approval from the Regional Committee. In the present case, the institution shifted to the new premises without obtaining the requisite approval from NCTE. This action constitutes a violation of the provisions of the NCTE Regulations.

3. The Committee also noted that in response to WRC SCN dated 20.03.2026 and the documents furnished by institution to WRC office on 16.04.2026 were examined and it is noted that the same is still deficient for the following:

- i. The institution has not submitted Building Completion Certificate in the prescribed format of NCTE (17 points) mentioning all the Khasra Nos. issued by the Competent Authority of State Government.

- ii. The institution has submitted Building Plan in the name of Somani Charitable Trust, Khasra No. 126, total plot area 10873.60sqmt. total built-up area 3807.28 sq.mt, area of class-rooms & multipurpose area not readable. Further, the building plan is approved by Gram Panchayat. The institution is required to submit the legible building plan approved by the Competent Authority of the State Government clearly mentioning the Khasra Nos., total land area, total built-up area and the earmarked area for each course being run in the premises. The dimension of the area of classrooms, multipurpose hall, Library, Laboratories etc. should be clearly legible.
- iii. The institution has not submitted Building Safety Certificate issued by the Competent Authority of the State Government.
- iv. The institution has submitted faculty list in the name of RSC College, Sikroda, faculty list, which is not approved by competent authority of its affiliating body.
- v. The institution has not submitted website be functional and updated in compliance to provisions under Clause 7(14)(i), 8(6), 8(14) and 10(3) of NCTE Regulations 2014 as amended from time to time.
- vi. The institution has not submitted the Mutation Certificate clearly mentioning the title of the land holder, Khasra nos. & land area issued by Competent Authority of State Government.
- vii. The institution has not submitted the NOC issued by the affiliating body for shifting of its premises.
- viii. The institution has uploaded Non-Encumbrance Certificate in the name of Somani Charitable Trust, Khasra No. 126/2, Land area is not mentioned. Further, the seal & signature of the issuing/approving authority are not readable.
- ix. The institution has not submitted the documentary evidence of maintenance of FDRs for Rs.5.00 lacs and 7.00 lacs towards Endowment and Reserve Fund in joint operation for each of the teacher education programme being conducted by it.

In view of the above, the Committee decided that, in compliance with the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide order dated 29.01.2026, the institution may be provided a period of three (03) days to rectify the aforesaid deficiencies by submitting its reply along with all requisite supporting documents.

Decision of WRC:

The file of the institution along with other related documents was carefully examined in the light of the NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time and the Committee observed as under:

The Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in W.P.(C)3614/2026 titled OM COLLEGE OF EDUCATION VS. NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR TEACHER EDUCATION & ANR vide its order 20.03.2026 disposed of the case with following directions, the operative part of the court is as under:

“(a) direct the Respondent No.2 to consider & decide the pending application of Petitioner Institution submitted for shifting of its premises, from its ‘existing’ to ‘new’, expeditiously & preferably within a period of one month; and...”

2. For the reasons stated in the petition, issue notice.

3. Mr. Sethi, learned counsel accepts notice on behalf of the respondent and states that the application will be decided expeditiously.

4. Hence, the petition is allowed and the respondent No.2 is directed to decide the application dated 08.12.2023 expeditiously and not later than 4 weeks from today.

5. With these directions, the petition is disposed of.”

The Committee took note of the fact that the institution has been requested vide WRC email dated 17.04.2026 to furnish the requisite information for conducting inspection in the prescribed proforma along with the supporting land documents for constituting the visiting team to cause virtual inspection. The institution has also been reminded vide email dated 22.04.2026. however, the reply is still awaited.

In view of the above, the Committee decided that, in compliance with the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide order dated 20.03.2026, the institution may be provided a period of three (03) days to furnish the requisite proforma with supporting documents.
