**Decision of WRC:**

The file of the institution along with other related documents was carefully examined in the light of the NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time, along with Order dated 20.03.2026 passed in W.P.(C) 2633/2020 titled “VIDYAWATI CHATURVEDI SHIKSHA MAHAVIDYALAYA vs. NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR TEACHER EDUCATION AND ORS.” and subsequent Order dated 08.05.2026 passed in CONT.CAS 828/2026 by Hon’ble High Court of Delhi, the Committee observed as under:

1. Recognition was granted for B.Ed. course of one year duration with annual intake of 100 students vide order dated 12.09.2008.
2. Revised recognition order for B.Ed. course of two years duration with annual intake of 100 (two basic units of 50 students each) was issued vide order dated 27.05.2015
3. Recognition for B.Ed. course was withdrawn by WRC vide order dated 19.09.2017.
4. Against the withdrawal order of WRC, the institution preferred an Appeal u/S 18 of NCTE Act, 1993 and the NCTE Appellate Authority vide order dated 13.02.2018 has remanded back the case to WRC.
5. The compliance submitted by the institution in response to Appeal was considered by WRC and the WRC in its 294<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on July 04-05, 2018 decided to restore recognition of B.Ed. Course of the institution with an intake of one unit. Accordingly, restoration order dated 09.07.2018 was issued to the institution.
6. Against the above decision of WRC, the institution preferred an Appeal u/S 18 of NCTE Act, 1993 and the NCTE Appellate Authority vide order dated 15.05.2019 has confirmed the order of WRC.
7. Thereafter, the institution filed a Writ Petition in the Hon’ble High Court of Delhi at New Delhi, and the Hon’ble High Court of Delhi in W.P. No. 2633/2020 vide Order dated 20.03.2026 has disposed of the Writ Petition with the direction to *consider the present petition as a representation and decide the same within 4 weeks from today after giving personal hearing to the representative of the petitioner in accordance with the existing rules. In case there is any deficiency in the documents/additional requirements regarding teachers, the respondent shall prior to deciding the application inform the petitioner in writing and the petitioner would be given an opportunity to rectify the shortcomings.*
8. The entire matter was considered by WRC in its 457<sup>th</sup> Part-I-A held on 20<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2026 and as per the decision of WRC, the letter dated 05.05.2026 was issued to the institution conveying the following decision of WRC:-

*“The Committee noted that the submission made by the institution in the Writ Petition, to be treated as a representation in pursuance of the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, has been duly considered and examined. The Committee further noted that the institution is, in effect, seeking restoration of the second unit of its B.Ed. course, which would amount to an increase in annual intake from the existing 50 seats (one unit) to 100 seats (two units). The Committee observed that under Section 15 of the NCTE Act, 1993, read with the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure)*

*Regulations, 2014, and the National Council for Teacher Education Rules, 1997, an institution seeking an increase of intake in an existing recognised course is mandatorily required to submit a fresh application in online mode in the prescribed format, along with the prescribed processing fee. The Committee noted that no such application has been submitted by the institution through the prescribed online mode as required under the extant Regulations. In view of the above, the representation of the institution seeking restoration of the second unit in the B.Ed. course cannot be acceded to, as allowing the same in the absence of a formal application would be contrary to and in contravention of the relevant provisions of the NCTE Act, 1993, Rules and Regulations made thereunder, and would lead to an anomalous situation inconsistent with the statutory framework governing recognition and increase of intake. Accordingly, the representation is found to be devoid of merit and is disposed of. The institution is at liberty to apply afresh for increase of intake in the existing B.Ed. course in accordance with the prescribed procedure, as and when applications are invited by the NCTE.”*

9. Thereafter, the institution challenged the decision taken by WRC in 457<sup>th</sup> (Part-I-A) meeting by filing court case Cont. CAS(C)828/2026 which has been disposed by the Hon’ble High Court of Delhi vide Order dated 08<sup>th</sup> May, 2026 as under :-

*“...9. Clearly, the respondent no.2/WRC has not considered the application of the petitioner on merits and has sought to reject the same only on a technical ground that the petitioner has failed to submit a fresh application in online mode in the prescribed format. The same ex facie results in wilful disobedience of the directions contained in the order dated 20.03.2026. In terms thereof, the respondent no.2 was mandated to consider the representation of the petitioner on merits. It was also implicit that an opportunity of hearing would be provided to the petitioner before taking the requisite decision. Paragraph-7 of the order dated 20.03.2026 goes on to clarify that an opportunity would be afforded to the petitioner to provide any document/ fulfil any additional requirement, so as to rectify any shortcoming.*

*10. In the circumstances, the decision taken during the final Minutes of the 457th meeting of the Western Regional Committee (WRC) held between 20th and 22nd April, 2026 qua the petitioner is set aside, being in wilful disobedience of the directions contained in the order dated 20.03.2026. It is agreed that the matter shall be considered afresh by the respondent no.2/Western Regional Committee (WRC) on merits and in accordance with law in line with the extant policy of the NCTE. An opportunity of hearing shall also be given to the petitioner*

*11. Let the said exercise be completed as expeditiously as possible and in any event within a period of two weeks from today.*

*12. The petition is disposed of in the above terms.*

*13. Order dasti.”*

10. Accordingly, as per the direction of the Hon’ble Court, the petitioner was requested to attend the personal hearing before the WRC and the representative of the petitioner i.e. Smt. Anajana Chaturvedi W/O Late Shri Priyawrath Chaturvedi, President Vidyawati Chaturvedi Shiksha Mahavidhyalaya attended the personal hearing before WRC on 15 May 2026 at 4 P.M.

11. The WRC patiently heard the representative of the petitioner institution, noted the oral submissions made by her, and observed the following:

- The institution has been recognised by NCTE at Plot No.38 & 40, Ward No. 33, Khasra No.3042, Saraswati Nagar, Panna Road, Chhattarpur, Madhya Pradesh, vide order dated 12.09.2008.
- The request of the institution to restore the second unit of its B.Ed. course which was discontinued by the WRC as per the decision taken by it in the 457<sup>th</sup> meeting will tantamount to an increase in annual intake of B.Ed. course from the existing 50 seats (one unit) to 100 seats (two units).
- Earlier WRC had taken decision not to allow the restoration of the intake from 50 to 100 students by the Vidyawati Chaturvedi Shiksha Mahavidhyalaya on the premise that the college is seeking

to increase the intake as a fresh application which as per Section 15 of the NCTE Act, 1993, read with the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014, and the National Council for Teacher Education Rules, 1997 is mandatorily required to be submitted in online mode in the prescribed format, along with the prescribed processing fee.

- d. However, now after directions of the Honourable High Court of Delhi, dated 08.05.2026, WRC has decided to give the Vidyawati Chaturvedi Shiksha Mahavidhyalaya another chance to explain why its application for restoring the second unit of its B.Ed. course resulting in increase of the total intake should again be considered by WRC.
- e. In view of the above, the Vidyawati Chaturvedi Shiksha Mahavidhyalaya is given another chance to represent its case with full facts complying with the objections of the WRC made while discontinuing the second unit of the B.Ed. course run by it.

**The Committee, on careful perusal of the entire matter, decided that before a final decision is taken by WRC, Show Cause Notice u/S 17(1) be issued giving an opportunity to the institution to submit its representation/ comments on the above observations of WRC within seven days.**

**Decision of WRC:**

The file of the institution along with other related documents was carefully examined in the light of the NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time, and the Committee observed as under:

The Committee noted that the institution has filed the court case W.P. No-5036/2026 before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and the Hon'ble Court has passed order dated: 06.05.2026 with following directions:

*“This is a writ petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking the following prayers:-*

- (a) Pass an appropriate order, direction or writ in the nature of mandamus or any other appropriate writ directing the respondent No.2/WRC to comply with the directions passed by the respondent No. 1/NCTE in its Appeal Order dated 02.03.2020 and also to comply with the directions passed in W.P.(c) NO. 7151/2021 vide order dated 28.07.2021 and to issue restoration order of recognition for conducting B.Ed. course.*
- (b) Pass an appropriate order, direction or writ in the nature of mandamus or any other appropriate writ directing the respondents to reflect the status of the petitioner as a recognized institution on its official website and permit the petitioner/institution to participate in the counselling and admit students for the year 2026-2027, in the interest of justice and in the facts and circumstances of the case and/or*
- (c) Pass an order directing the respondent no.2 to send copy of such restoration order to the affiliating university of the petitioner namely “Jiwaji University, Gwalior” ...”*

*2. This order is being passed in view of a similar order dated 07.04.2026 passed in W.P.(C) 4499/2026, covering the present issue. Based upon the said order and using the same reasons and expressions, this order is being passed.*

3. Mr. Kumar, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submits that petitioner was granted recognition by Western Regional Committee (“WRC”) on 24.02.2014 for conducting B.Ed. Course with an annual intake of 100 seats. He states that statutory appeal was preferred by the petitioner and the matter was remanded by the Appellate Committee to WRC to take further decision.
4. He submits that the only grievance of the petitioner is that while the matter was remanded by the Appellate Committee the impugned withdrawal order was quashed and set aside and till date the WRC has not issued the restoration order.
5. For the said reasons, issue notice.
6. Mr. Kapoor, learned counsel accepts notice on behalf of the respondents and on instructions, affirms the aforesaid factual position.
7. Let WRC take a fresh decision and communicate the same to the petitioner.”

**In view of the above, the Committee decided that in accordance with the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, vide its order dated 06.05.2026, the recognition for the B.Ed. course is restored with an annual intake of 100 students (two basic units of 50 students each).**

**The restoration order shall be displayed on the NCTE website, with the institution's status updated in the list of recognized institutions. The order shall also be forwarded to the affiliating body, State Government, and all concerned authorities for compliance.**

**Decision of WRC:**

The file of the institution along with other related documents was carefully examined in the light of the NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time, and the Committee observed as under:

The Committee noted that the institution has filed the court case W.P. No- 5918/2026 before the hon'ble high court of Delhi and the court has passed order dated: 07.05.2026 with following directions:

“1. This is a writ petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking the following prayers:-

- a. issue a writ of mandamus or any other suitable writ or order holding that the withdrawal order dated 02.01.2018 issued by WRC stands quashed/ annulled by the order dated 31.12.2018 passed by NCTE Appeal Committee; and/or
- b. issue a writ of mandamus or any other suitable writ or order or direction to the Respondents to issue the order of restoration of recognition for B.Ed Course with 100 seats (two basic units); and/or
- c. issue a writ of mandamus or any other suitable writ or order or direction to the Respondents to display the name of Petitioner institution in the list/ category of recognised institutions for conducting B.Ed Course on their website along with recognition/ restoration order for B.Ed Course and to inform the Affiliating University as well as Department of Higher Education, Government of Madhya Pradesh communicating the restoration order and recognition status of

*petitioner institution for conducting B.Ed Course with 100 seats (two basic units) enabling the petitioner to participate in the counselling & admission process for the academic year 2026-27 and for subsequent years. ...”*

2. *Mr. Kumar, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submits that petitioner was granted recognition by WRC on 03.03.2014 for conducting B.Ed Course with an annual intake of 100 seats. However, the recognition granted to the petitioner was withdrawn on 02.01.2018.*
3. *He submits that statutory appeal was preferred by the petitioner and on 31.12.2018 the matter was remanded by the Appellate Committee to WRC to take further decision and withdrawal order was kept in abeyance.*
4. *He submits that the only grievance of the petitioner is that while the matter was remanded by the Appellate Committee, but it did not quash the withdrawal order dated 02.01.2018.*
5. *Mr. Kapoor, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the respondent/NCTE, on instructions, affirms the aforesaid factual position.*
6. *In view of the above, it is deemed appropriate to dispose of the present petition by clarifying that the order dated 31.12.2018 passed by the Appellate Committee would be treated as quashing of the withdrawal order dated 02.01.2018.*
7. *Let WRC take a fresh decision and communicate the same to the petitioner.*
8. *The WRC is directed to issue an order of restoration of recognition within a period of one week from today, which will govern the rights and contentions of the parties, until and unless fresh withdrawal order is passed by the WRC.*
9. *The petitioner will be permitted to participate in the counselling and admit students for the academic session 2026-27 and also subsequently, till the time a fresh withdrawal order is passed against it.*
10. *The status of petitioners as recognized institution will also be reflected on the official website of respondents/NCTE and will be communicated by the NCTE to petitioners' affiliating body as well as to the concerned department of the State Government within 1 week.*
11. *The petition is disposed of in the above terms.”*

**In view of the above, the Committee decided that in accordance with the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, vide its order dated 07.05.2026, the recognition for the B.Ed. course is restored with an annual intake of 100 students (two units of 50 students each).**

**The restoration order shall be displayed on the NCTE website, with the institution's status updated in the list of recognized institutions. The order shall also be forwarded to the affiliating body, State Government, and all concerned authorities for compliance.**

As a part of compliance of directions passed vide order dated 15.12.2025 in W.P. No. 5369/2025 titled as Teachers training college Mirza vs. National Council for Teacher Education & Anr. by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, the related matter was considered by WRC in its 445th (Part-1) meeting of WRC held on 07th-10th January 2026. As per decision of WRC, restoration order have been issued to various teacher education institutions (TEIs).

In reference to order dated 15.12.2025 passed by Hon'ble High Court of Delhi (on PAR batch matters), the Hon'ble Court has passed orders (on similar case) with the following directions:

“..1. The learned counsels appearing on behalf of the petitioners urges the court that the present petitions may also be disposed of in terms of the order passed by this court of 15.12.2025 in batch of petitions, lead case being W.P. No. 5369/2025 titled as Teacher Training College Mirza vs. National Council for Teacher Education & Anr. 3 In view of the above, the present petitions along with pending applications are disposed of in terms of order dated 15.12.2025, the benefit of which shall also ensure to the present petitioners...”
