The original file of the institution along with other related documents was carefully examined in the light of the NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were considered by WRC and the Committee observed as under:-

Facts of the case

1. This institution was recognised by WRC with an annual intake of 100 students vide order dated 31.08.2006.
2. After promulgation of NCTE Regulations, 2014, the Revised recognition order was issued to the institution vide order No. WRC/APW01998/123283/2015 /142595,601, 603,608, 621,625,631 dated 31.5.2015 with an annual intake of 100 students.
3. The request of the institution for reduction of intake of the institution to one unit was considered by WRC and as per the decision of 259th meeting of WRC held on September 21-23, 2016 an order reducing the intake from 100 to 50 was issued vide Order No. WRC/APW01998/123283/259th/ 2016/ 182636-41 dated 28.3.2017.
4. The institution requested for reopening of 2nd unit of B.Ed. with an intake of 50 students on 2.4.2022 & on 24.11.2023.
5. The institution approached the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and the Hon'ble Court in W.P. (C) 4151/2026 has passed order dated: 01.04.2026 directing the respondents i.e NCTE to decide the petitioners' representation dated 23.11.2023, expeditiously by a speaking order within 8 weeks from today.

Decision of WRC:

In pursuance of order dated 01.04.2026 passed by Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, the Committee noted that as per available record of WRC, there is no representation dated 23.11.2023 rather as per available record of WRC, NCTE, there is representation dated 24.11.2023. The representation dated 24.11.2023 was considered by WRC and WRC observed the following :-

- i. On the request received from the institution, the intake of B.Ed. course has been reduced by WRC from 100 to 50 vide order dated 28.03.2017.
- ii. The Committee noted that the institution in its representation has sought re-opening of 2nd unit of B.Ed. course, which would amount to an increase in annual intake from the existing 50 (one unit) to 100 (two units).
- iii. As per Section 15 of the NCTE Act, 1993, read with the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014, and the National Council for Teacher Education Rules, 1997, an institution seeking an increase of intake in an existing recognised course is mandatorily required to submit a fresh application in online mode in the prescribed format, along with the prescribed processing fee.
- iv. No such application has been submitted by the institution through the prescribed online mode as required under the extant Regulations. In view of the above, the representation of the institution seeking restoration of the second unit in the B.Ed. course cannot be acceded to, as allowing the same in the absence of a formal application would be contrary to and in contravention of the relevant provisions of the NCTE Act, 1993, Rules and Regulations made thereunder, and would lead to an

anomalous situation inconsistent with the statutory framework governing recognition and increase of intake.

The original file of the institution along with other related documents was carefully examined in the light of the NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were considered by WRC and the Committee observed as under:

Facts of the case

1. This institution was recognised by WRC with an annual intake of 100 students vide order dated 20.08.2006.
2. After promulgation of NCTE Regulations, 2014, the Revised recognition order was issued to the institution vide order No. WRC/APW04009/123479/2015/40303-310 dated 31.5.2015 with an annual intake of 100 students.
3. The request of the institution for reduction of intake of the institution to one unit was considered by WRC and as per the decision of 259th meeting of WRC held on September 21-23, 2016 an order reducing the intake from 100 to 50 was issued vide Order No. WRC/APW04009/123479/2017/183360 dated 10.04.2017 with an intake of 1 unit of 50 intake
4. The institution requested for reopening of 2nd unit of B.Ed. with an intake of 50 students on 08.02.2024 due to increase trends of B.Ed. admission.
5. The institution approached the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and the Hon'ble Court in W.P. (C) 4417/2026 has passed order dated: 06.04.2026 directing the respondents i.e NCTE to decide the petitioners' representation dated 08.02.2024, expeditiously by a speaking order within 8 weeks from today.

Decision of WRC:

In pursuance of order dated 06.04.2026 passed by Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, the Committee considered the representation dated 08.02.2024 of the petitioner institution and noted the following :-

- i. On the request received from the institution, the intake of B.Ed. course has been reduced by WRC from 100 to 50 vide order dated 10.04.2017.
- ii. The Committee noted that the institution in its representation has sought re-opening of 2nd unit of B.Ed. course, which would amount to an increase in annual intake from the existing 50 (one unit) to 100 (two units).
- iii. As per Section 15 of the NCTE Act, 1993, read with the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014, and the National Council for Teacher Education Rules, 1997, an institution seeking an increase of intake in an existing recognised course is mandatorily required to submit a fresh application in online mode in the prescribed format, along with the prescribed processing fee.
- iv. No such application has been submitted by the institution through the prescribed online mode as required under the extant Regulations. In view of the above, the representation of the institution seeking restoration of the second unit in the B.Ed. course cannot be acceded to, as allowing the same

in the absence of a formal application would be contrary to and in contravention of the relevant provisions of the NCTE Act, 1993, Rules and Regulations made thereunder, and would lead to an anomalous situation inconsistent with the statutory framework governing recognition and increase of intake.

The original file of the institution along with other related documents was carefully examined in the light of the NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were considered by WRC and the Committee observed as under:

Facts of the case

1. This institution was recognised by WRC with an annual intake of 100 students vide order dated 31.08.2006.
2. After promulgation of NCTE Regulations, 2014, the Revised recognition order was issued to the institution vide order No. WRC/APW02216/123304/2015/140370 dated 31.5.2015 with an annual intake of 50 (one unit).
3. The institution requested for reopening of 2nd unit of B.Ed. with an intake of 50 students on 2.4.2022 & on 24.11.2023.
4. The request of the institution for reduction of intake of the institution to one unit was considered by WRC and as per the decision of 259th meeting of WRC held on September 21-23, 2016, an order reducing the intake from 100 to 50 was issued vide Order No. WRC/APW01998/123283/259th/2016/182636-41 dated 28.3.2017.
5. As the request of the institution was not considered by WRC, the institution has approached Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide WP(C)4452/2026 and the Hon'ble Court vide order dated 06.04.2026 has passed an order directing the respondents to decide the petitioners' representation dated 11.03.2022, expeditiously by a speaking order within 8 weeks from today.

Decision of WRC:

In pursuance of order dated 06.04.2026 passed by Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, the Committee noted that as per available record of WRC, there is no representation dated 11.03.2022 rather as per available record of WRC, NCTE, there is representation dated 11.03.2024. The representation dated 11.03.2024 was considered by WRC and WRC noted the following :-

- i. On the request received from the institution, the intake of B.Ed. course has been reduced from 100 to 50 vide order dated 31.05.2015.
- ii. The Committee noted that the institution in its representation has sought re-opening of 2nd unit of B.Ed. course, which would amount to an increase in annual intake from the existing 50 (one unit) to 100 (two units).
- iii. As per Section 15 of the NCTE Act, 1993, read with the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014, and the National Council for Teacher Education Rules, 1997, an institution seeking

- an increase of intake in an existing recognised course is mandatorily required to submit a fresh application in online mode in the prescribed format, along with the prescribed processing fee.
- iv. No such application has been submitted by the institution through the prescribed online mode as required under the extant Regulations. <p><u>Decision of WRC :-</u></p> <p>The original file of the institution along with other related documents was carefully examined in the light of the NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were considered by WRC and the Committee observed as under:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. The institution was granted recognition by WRC for B.Ed & D.El.Ed courses. ii. The institution has submitted its letter dated 23.12.2025 regarding shifting of location of new premises received on 30.12.2025. iii. The institution approached the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and the order dated 29.01.2026 in W.P.(C) 1207/2026 was considered by WRC in its 453rd (Part-II) WRC meeting held on 05th to 07th March 2026 and as per the decision of WRC Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution on 20.03.2026 and also email sent to the institution on 21.03.2026. iv. The Show Cause Notice sent to the institution as well as to the society both have returned undelivered by postal department with the remarks "No such person in this address " v. Apart from sending by post, the SCN was also sent to the institution at mail id of the institution i.e. rscngwl@gmail.com on 21.03.2026. No response has been received from the institution till date. vi. Though, no response was received from the institution to the SCN dated 20.03.2026 issued by WRC, the matter was considered by WRC in its 457th (P-1 C) held on 20th to 22nd April 2026 and as per the decision of WRC, letter was issued to the institution and the reply dated 19.05.2026 submitted by the institution was considered by WRC in its next meeting held on 03-04 June, 2026 and WRC observed the following: - vii. The institution has replied that it applied for shifting of premises in year 2006 but WRC has not taken any decision till date. However, as per available records the institution had submitted its application for shifting of premises on 24/10/2013. Further, there is no provision in NCTE Act, Rules and Regulations for granting post facto approval of such shifting of the college premises. Considering the directions of the Hon'ble Court, the documents submitted by the Institution was considered by WRC and the Committee observed that:- <p>The institution claims that it was forced to shift its premises in the interest of students to provide them safety, security and better education which is not acceptable to the WRC in view of the following facts:-</p>			

	<p>a. The college applied for recognition for D.El.Ed course in 2007 to be run from the existing premises itself which was considered by WRC and permission was granted in 2008 for running D.El.Ed at the existing premises itself i.e. R.S.C. College, Basant Parisar Mayur Market, Gandhi Road, Gwalior-474011, Madhya Pradesh only.</p> <p>b. As per available records the institution had applied for shifting of premises to WRC in October 2013. The same was considered by WRC in its 229th meeting held on July 21-22, 2015 and as per the decision of WRC, the institution was directed to submit documents vide letter dated 30.07.2015. No reply has been submitted by the institution in response to WRC letter dated 30.07.2015.</p> <p>c. The institution vide its letter sent to WRC in November 2006 alongwith affidavit has intimated that it has shifted to the new premises i.e. RSC College, Plot No. 117, Khasra No. 117, Village/Town/City- Sikroda (Badori), Jhansi Road, District-Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh, which is a clear cut violation of the provision of NCTE Regulations. The institutions desirous for shifting of premises has to make an application alongwith the essential documents to the concerned Regional Committee and only after approval of the Regional Committee, the institution can shift to the new premises.</p> <p>d. The institution has misrepresented the facts to the Hon'ble Court /NCTE that the college has already applied to NCTE for shifting of premises to the new address i.e. RSC College, Plot No. 117, Khasra No. 117, Village/Town/City- Sikroda (Badori), Jhansi Road, District-Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh in 2006 whereas it has submitted the application for shifting of premises to WRC in October 2013.</p> <p>e. The Building plan submitted is not approved by the Competent Government Authority.</p> <p>f. The Building Safety Certificate submitted is issued in 2021 from Consulting Engineer. The institution has not submitted the latest Building Safety Certificate. Moreover, the same is not submitted by the Competent Govt authority.</p> <p>g. The submitted staff list is not approved by the affiliating body.</p> <p>h. The staff list submitted is only for 18 staff which is not sufficient for the existing B.Ed (2 units) and D.El.Ed (1 Unit) course (s).</p> <p>i. The institution has not submitted the NOC of the affiliating body for shifting of premises.</p> <p>j. The institution has submitted Non-Encumbrance Certificate in the name of Somani Charitable Trust, Survey No. 126, total land area 1.240H. issued by D.K. bhardwas, Advocate dated 03.05.2026 and not from the Competent Authority of the State Government.</p> <p>k. The institution in its reply has stated that the original FDR No. 538900DP00016787 dated 02.05.2026 for Rs. 5.00 lacs is attached, however, on perusal of original FDR, it is seen that the FDR is for Rs. 4.00 lacs and not for 5.00 lacs.</p> <p>l. Regarding FDR for Rs. 7.00 lacs towards Reserve Fund, the institution has stated that the same is lying with WRC, however, no copy has been submitted.</p> <p>m. Further, as the institution is running two courses, it is required to maintain the Endowment Fund and Reserve Fund of Rs. 10 lacs and 14 lacs, respectively. Documentary proof with regard to maintenance of Endowment and Reserve Fund not submitted.</p> <p>Keeping in view the above facts, the WRC observed that the application of the institution for shifting of premises is mis-representation of the facts to mislead the WRC to get retrospective approval for shifting of the premises of the institution in contravention of the NCTE Regulations and Committee decided that the application of the institution for shifting of premises be Refused.</p>

The original file of the institution along with other related documents was carefully examined in the light of the NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were considered by WRC and the Committee observed as under:

Facts of the case :-

1. The committee noted that RK B.ED. College, Ram Nagar, Rawate Compound, Tembepada Road, Bhandup (W), Mumbai-78, Maharashtra was granted recognition for conducting B.Ed. of one year duration for 100 intakes vide order dated. 29.01.2008. Thereafter, on promulgation of NCTE Regulations 2014, Revised Recognition order was issued to institution for two units (100 intake) on 06.10.2015.
2. The Show Cause Notice issued to the institution vide No. WRC/APW03737/123434/ MH/2016/ 180607-608 dated 21.02.2017 for compliance of the conditions mentioned in the Revised Order.
3. The institution has not submitted the requisite documents mentioned in the Show Cause Notice Therefore, Withdrawal Order vide No. WRC/APW03737/ 123434/ 311th/2019/206761-206767 was issued to the institution on 11.10.2019.
4. Against the above decision of WRC, the institution has submitted Court Order passed by Delhi High Court dated 24.01.2020 W.P.(C) 13922/2019 & CM APPL. 55790/2019, wherein the Hon'ble Delhi High Court has directed as under :-

“(6) Accordingly, the impugned order dated 11.10.2019 passed by the WRC is set aside.

(7) The petitioner is granted two weeks to file a reply to the SCN upon a copy of the same being supplied to it by the respondents. The respondents will furnish a copy of the SCN dated 21.02.2017 within one week of receipt of a copy of the order passed today.

(8) The WRC will reconsider the matter after giving due opportunity of hearing to the authorized representative of the petitioner.

(9) The WRC will pass, thereafter, a speaking order; a copy of which will be furnished to the petitioner.”

5. Accordingly, as per the directions of the Hon'ble Court, the institution was requested to attend the personal hearing on 22.07.2020, however it did not attend the same. The institution was again requested to be present on 10.09.2020 for personal hearing through virtual mode, however, it did not attend the same.
6. Thereafter final show cause notice was issued to institution on 05.03.2025 for the deficiencies observed by WRC. The institution submitted its reply vide letter dated 25.05.2025 which was considered by the WRC in its 427th meeting held on 12th- 13th June 2025 and as per the decision of WRC, show cause notice to the institution for the deficiencies was issued on 23.07.2025.
7. The reply submitted by the institution has been considered by WRC 462nd meeting held on 03rd to 4th June 2026 and the committee noted the following deficiencies.
 - (i) The list of teaching staff submitted by the institution is neither approved by the affiliating body and nor in the NCTE prescribed format available on official website of WRC.
 - (ii) The affidavits on Rs.10 Non-Judicial Stamp Paper of individual teaching faculty are not submitted by the institution.
 - (iii) The institution has not submitted the latest Non-Encumbrance Certificate issued by the Competent Govt Authority.
 - (iv) The institution has submitted stability report dated 13.01.2024 issued by Private Chartered Engineer instead of Building Safety Certificate. The institution has not submitted Building Safety Certificate in adherence of safety guidelines as prescribed by National/State Disaster Management Authority issued by Competent Government Authority.

- (v) The institution has not submitted Fire Safety Certificate issued by issued by Fire Safety Department, Government of Maharashtra verifiable on the official portal of the Fire Department, Government of Maharashtra.
- (vi) The institution has not submitted Certificate to the effect that the building is differently abled friendly issued by the Competent Government Authority.

In view of the above, the WRC decided that the recognition granted to the institution for B.Ed course be withdrawn u/s 17 of the NCTE Act, 1993 from the date of issue of order.

Decision of WRC :-

The WRC, after following extant procedure of NCTE, have decided to refuse the below mentioned online transition applications (2026-2027) from existing B.A.B.Ed./B.Sc.B.Ed. into ITEP programme.

2. Being aggrieved against the decision of WRC in refusing/rejecting transition applications, the above mentioned institutions approached the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi by filing Writ Petitions mentioned against each.

3. The Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide its order dated 29.05.2026 in W.P.(C) 4860/2026 titled as VISION COLLEGE OF TEACHER TRAINING vs. NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR TEACHER EDUCATION along with other batch matters has disposed the writ petitions with the following directions:-

"...16. For the said reasons, the present petition is allowed and the impugned Refusal Order dated 11.03.2026 is set aside. Accordingly, the respondents shall conduct inspection of the petitioner College within 3 weeks from today and shall thereafter take all appropriate necessary steps to ensure that the guidelines of the Hon'ble Supreme Court are scrupulously complied with. The entire exercise including the issuance of show cause notice pointing out the deficiencies, furnishing of their replies, and the adjudication of those show cause notices, shall be completed on or before 30.06.2026, for the academic session 2026- 2027. Let a copy of the inspection report also be supplied to the petitioner.

17. This order is being passed in peculiar facts and circumstances of this case, where the institute in question seeking transition, is already an institute operating a 4-year integrated B.A.B.Ed./ B.Sc. B.Ed. course and the infrastructural requirements are not substantially different.

18. With these directions, the present petition is disposed of, along with pending applications, if any."

4. The Panel Counsel for NCTE has also given his Legal Opinion in the matter.

The entire matter was discussed thoroughly by WRC in detail and the WRC decided that as per the opinion of the Legal Counsel for NCTE and directions of the Hon'ble Court, Visiting Team be constituted for Virtual Inspection of the Institution (s) in order to ascertain and scrutinize all the essential documents and at the time of verification,

- VT shall also check/ verify student list year-wise (I,II,III,IV), functional website uploaded with mandatory disclosure documents, Building Safety Certificate in adherence of safety guidelines as prescribed by National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), Fire Safety Certificate with requisite approved Plot Area by Govt. authority and all Building & land related documents i.e. Certified Registered Land documents, Mutation Certificate, Land Use Certificate (CLU), Non-Encumbrance Certificate, check the approved Building Plan, approved Site Plan showing contiguity of plots, conform that the land reserved for each course run within the institution's premises and the demarcated construction area for teacher education programmes including multidisciplinary programmes should be mentioned;
- VT shall check availability of requisite numbers of Classrooms, size of Multipurpose Hall with all equipment, different subject-wise Laboratories and its record keeping, Library resources having available space in library-cum-reading room and its record keeping, digitalization of library components, check Activity cum Resource Centre equipped with all facilities as per norms, Health and Physical Education Room with adequate games and sports equipment as per norms, Faculty Rooms with equipment, Administrative Office Space with equipment, Common Room, Store room with adequate space, check functional and appropriate furniture for general and differently able persons in required number for instructional and other purposes, Playground having sports and games facilities, check the institution environment is disable friendly having requisite facilities fully compatible for Persons With Disability (PWD) as per norms;
