- Recognition was granted to the aforesaid institution for conducting B.Ed. course of one-year duration with an annual intake of 100 students from the academic session 2012-2013 *vide* order No. NRC/NCTE/HP-292/202nd meeting/2012/ 28123-129 dated 06.08.2012 followed by revised recognition order of two-year duration with an annual intake of 100 students from the academic session 2015-2016 *vide* order No. NRC/NCTE/HP-292/2015/111512-17 dated 05.06.2015.

 - The Committee considered the complaint in its 449th meeting held on 13th & 14th October 2025, and decided to forward the same to the institution to offer its point-wise reply on the issue (s) raised by the complainant within 15 days from the date of issue of letter by the office of NRC.
 - As per decision of NRC in its 449th meeting held on 13th & 14th October, 2025, a letter was issued to the institution *vide* No. NRC/NCTE/HP-71 & HP-125/B.Ed. & D.El.Ed./449th Meeting (Sl.No.4)/2025/Computer No. 75357/234431-234435 dated 17.12.2025.
 - The aforesaid complaint was closed by the NCTE Hqrs. (Complaint Section) *vide* its letter dated 10.11.2025.
- ❖ The matter was further considered by the Committee in its 435th Meeting (Volume-III) held on 03rd & 04th March 2025 on receipt of representation dated 27/01/2025 from the institution, *inter alia* requesting to permit the institution to run the institution from the extended building as the land & building of the institution have been acquired by the NHAI for the purpose of constructing the National Highway. NRC decided to accord permission to the institution to offer its B.Ed. & D.El.Ed. course from the extended building which was valid for a period not more than one year from the date of submission of representation by the institution to the office of NRC i.e. up to 26.01.2026. In the meantime, the institution shall submit the essential documents to the office of NRC on or before 26.01.2026 of new land and building as required under NCTE Regulations 2014.

- Initial recognition to the institution was granted by NRC in a leased premises and later on, the same land was registered in the name of institution. As the building has already been constructed on the said leased land, this fact is not mentioned in the registered sale deed.

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- The institution has submitted a list of faculty comprising of 01 Principal & 5 Assistant Professor(s) duly approved by the Pro. Vice Chancellor, Sardar Patel University, Mandi alongwith the copy of approval letter in respect of Principal and 05 faculty issued by H.P. University dated 10.05.2010 & 20.07.2019. The institution has also submitted another faculty list comprising of 04 Assistant Professor (s) which is selected by the Management and not approved by the affiliating body. As such, requisite number of teaching faculty qualified as per NCTE norms is not appointed.
- Quality education is the foundation of a prosperous future, transforming minds from empty vessels into open. Quality education is an important aspect in providing high quality, equitable and accessible education. In the absence of requisite faculty as per NCTE Regulations 2014, the quality education could not be delivered, and an institution should not be allowed/ permitted to offer the programme.
- The Committee deliberated on the documents submitted by the institution in reply to Show Cause Notices/ letter issued to it and noted that the institution is still deficient in multiple parameters inclusive of shortage of faculty for the B.Ed. course, as per NCTE Regulations 2014 despite reasonable opportunities provided to the institution.

Hence, the Committee decided that that recognition granted to the institution for offering B.Ed. course be withdrawn under section 17(1) of the NCTE Act, 1993 with effect from the end of academic session next following the date of communication of withdrawal order.

- The institution failed to submit affiliation order(s) for the teacher education course (s) being offered by it for the last 3 years issued by the affiliating body.
- Quality education is the foundation of a prosperous future, transforming minds from empty vessels into open. Quality education is an important aspect in providing high quality, equitable and accessible education. In the absence of requisite faculty as per NCTE Regulations 2014, the quality education could not be delivered, and an institution should not be allowed/ permitted to offer the programme.
- The Committee deliberated on the documents submitted by the institution in reply to Show Cause Notices/ letter issued to it and noted that the institution is still deficient in multiple parameters inclusive of shortage of faculty for the B.Ed. course, as per NCTE Regulations 2014 despite reasonable opportunities provided to the institution.

- The institution was required to submit the affiliation order for the last 3 years whereas the institution has only submitted the copy of the notification issued by the HP University regarding constitution of inspection for granting temporary affiliation for B.Ed. course for the academic session 2025-2026.
- Quality education is the foundation of a prosperous future, transforming minds from empty vessels into open. Quality education is an important aspect in providing high quality, equitable and accessible education. In the absence of requisite faculty as per NCTE Regulations 2014, the quality education could not be delivered, and an institution should not be allowed/ permitted to offer the programme.
- The Committee deliberated on the documents submitted by the institution in reply to Show Cause Notices/ letter issued to it and noted that the institution is still deficient in multiple parameters inclusive of shortage of faculty for the B.Ed. course, as per NCTE Regulations 2014 despite reasonable opportunities provided to the institution.

Hence, the Committee decided that the recognition granted to the institution for offering B.Ed. & D.El.Ed. course be withdrawn under section 17(1) of the NCTE Act, 1993 with effect from the end of academic session next following the date of communication of withdrawal order.

Decision of NRC

The online file(s) of the aforesaid 08 institutions (From Sl. No. 34 to 41) along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Rules, NCTE Regulations 2014, SOP, guidelines issued from time to time were placed before the Northern Regional Committee. The Committee noted the following: -

- The Petitioner Institutions submitted applications for transition of its B.A. B.Ed./B.Sc. B.Ed. courses to I.T.E.P. Course. NRC issued the impugned order dated 25.11.2025, refusing the transition application citing alleged deficiencies in the submission, as the Committee observed that the application of the institution was liable to be refused in pursuance of the Public Notice dated 12.09.2025 issued on the official portal of the NCTE, wherein it has been stipulated that institutions which do not fulfil the prescribed requirement of being a multidisciplinary institution shall be summarily rejected by the concerned Regional Committee.
- The Petitioner challenged the order of the NRC before the Hon'ble High Court on the ground that no opportunity was given to make a written representation. The institution filed W.P.(C) 19716/2025 & CM APPL. CM APPL. 82338/2025 before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in this regard and the Hon'ble Court passed an order dated 24.12.2025 with the following directions: -

The Court held that the impugned order, though based on alleged deficiencies in the application, was passed without granting the petitioner a reasonable opportunity of making a written representation as mandated by

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the proviso to Section 14(3)(b) of the NCTE Act, 1993. Such denial of opportunity violated principles of natural justice and the mandatory statutory requirement.

The contention of the respondents/NCTE that the decision amounted to a mere “rejection” under Regulation 7(1) of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 and not a “refusal” attracting Section 14(3)(b), was rejected. The Court held that the distinction between “rejection” and “refusal” under the Regulations is irrelevant for the applicability of Section 14(3)(b), which mandates an opportunity of representation before denial of recognition or transition. Reliance on clauses of the Public Notice dated 12.09.2025 to justify summary rejection was also negated as executive instructions cannot override statutory provisions.

Accordingly, the impugned order dated 25.11.2025 by NRC was set aside. The respondents/NRC were directed to issue a show cause notice specifying deficiencies, grant the petitioner an opportunity to submit a written representation within two weeks, and thereafter pass a fresh reasoned order within two weeks in accordance with law. The Court clarified that it expressed no opinion on the merits of the case and disposed of the writ petition.

The operative part of the Court order is read out as below:

“10. At this stage, learned counsel for the Respondents albeit conceding that there is no power under NCTE Act or Regulations framed thereunder to summarily reject an application seeking transition or recognition, submits that the source of power is in Clauses 6(iii) and 12 of Public Notice dated 12.09.2025. This argument only deserves to be rejected. No doubt, an executive order or circular can be enforced, however, if the provisions of an executive order or a circular are in the teeth of statutory provisions, they can have no force of law. In the present case, Proviso to sub-Section 3(b) of Section 14 of NCTE Act mandates an opportunity of making a written representation and anything contrary thereto in the Public Notice cannot be sustained.

11. Accordingly, without going into the merits of the case, this writ petition is allowed to a limited extent of setting aside impugned order dated 25.11.2025 on the ground that no reasonable opportunity was given to the Petitioner to make a written representation. It will be open to the Respondents to issue a show cause notice to the Petitioner pointing out deficiencies/shortcomings and calling upon the Petitioner to make a written representation. On receipt of the show cause notice, Petitioner shall submit its response within two weeks from the date of receipt and thereafter, it will be open to the Respondents to pass a fresh order in accordance with law and

after considering the representation. The order shall be passed within two weeks and communicated to the Petitioner. Needless to state, the Petitioner will be at liberty to take recourse to legal remedies in case it is aggrieved by the order.”

Pursuant to the said court judgment, the matter was placed before the NRC at its 454th Meeting held on 29th & 30TH December, 2025 whereupon, as per the minutes of the meeting (volume 1) the Committee resolved as follows:

“The Committee, after thorough examination and deliberation, decided that the file should be referred to the NCTE, HQs for the purpose of challenging the order by submitting a Letters Patent Appeal (LPA) to the Hon’ble High Court of Delhi. Additionally, the file should be processed to request an urgent stay on compliance with the Court’s order regarding the matter in question. Once the stay is obtained, the Regional Office may contest the order based on its merits.”

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The Committee, upon due consideration, examination of records, and detailed deliberations, resolved to refer the matter to the NCTE Headquarters for initiation of appropriate legal proceedings to assail the impugned order by way of filing an appeal/LPA before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi. The Committee further resolved that the matter be processed on an urgent and priority basis for seeking an interim stay of the operation and implementation of the said order. Subject to the grant of such interim relief, the NRC shall contest the impugned order on merits, strictly in accordance with law.

Consequently, the file was forwarded to the Headquarters with the intention of seeking permission to file an LPA in the matter. However, no instructions, directions, or approval regarding the filing of the LPA have been received to date.

The court order clearly stipulates that, without going into the merits of the case, a reasonable opportunity of being heard shall be afforded to the petitioners. Accordingly, a Show Cause Notice (SCN) may be issued to all the affected institutes before taking any further action in the matter.

After perusal and deliberation, the Committee observed that the application of the institution was liable to be refused in pursuance of the Public Notice dated 12.09.2025 issued on the official portal of the NCTE, wherein it has been stipulated that institutions which do not fulfil the prescribed requirement of being a multidisciplinary institution shall be summarily rejected by the concerned Regional Committee.

However, in compliance with the directions contained in the Order dated 24.12.2025 passed by the Hon'ble High Court, it is clear that the Court has not gone into the merits of the case and has directed that a reasonable opportunity be provided to the petitioner institution. Accordingly, the Committee resolved to undertake a scrutiny of the application, including the preliminary criteria mentioned therein, submitted by the petitioner institution before issuance of any Show Cause Notice.

Decision of NRC

The online file(s) of the aforesaid 6 institutions (From Sl. No. 42 to 47) along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Rules, NCTE Regulations 2014, SOP, guidelines issued from time to time were placed before the Northern Regional Committee. The Committee noted the following: -

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- The aforesaid Institutions had applied online before the NRC for grant of recognition and after inspection and consideration of the application in various meetings, the application of the institution was initially rejected and a Refusal Orders were issued.
- Aggrieved by the same, the institution approached the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in various writ petitions, pursuant to which the matter was reconsidered by the NRC in 2021/2022, show cause notices were issued, and subsequently recognition was granted for the B.A.B.Ed./B.Sc.B.Ed. programme with intakes as per the applications from the academic session 2022–23. Thereafter, the NRC in its subsequent meetings observed that the recognition had been granted under Appendix-13 after its omission and accordingly issued a Show Cause Notice under Section 17 of the NCTE Act, 1993 on 27.01.2023, which was challenged before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in W.P.(C) 1608/2023 and other connected matters.
- The Hon'ble Court passed orders directing the institutions to submit replies and for the NRC to take a fresh decision. Meanwhile, the institutions applied for transition of the programme to ITEP for the academic session 2025–26, which applications were refused. Subsequently, the NRC in its 453rd Meeting held on 11–12 December 2025 decided to withdraw the recognition of the 4-year Integrated B.A.B.Ed./B.Sc.B.Ed. programme under Section 17(1) of the NCTE Act, 1993. The said decision was challenged before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, and the Court vide order dated 11.02.2026 allowed the writ petition and set aside the decision of the NRC taken in the 453rd Meeting, thereby quashing the withdrawal of recognition and directing that the recognition shall remain operative.
- The Committee, after deliberation, observed that as per the Public Notice dated 12.09.2025 bearing File No. NCTE-Reg012/7/2025-Reg.Sec-HQ (available in the public domain), online applications were invited by NCTE vide public notice dated 05.02.2024 from teacher education institutions that had been granted recognition (prior to the omission of Appendix-13 of the NCTE Regulations, 2014) by the Regional Committees of NCTE to offer the 4-year Integrated B.Sc. B.Ed./B.A. B.Ed. programme under the omitted Appendix-13 of the NCTE Regulations, 2014, for transition of the said programme into ITEP as prescribed in the NCTE (Amendment) Regulations, 2021 dated 22.10.2021.
- However, it was observed that the said colleges are already running the programme in the ongoing academic session 2025–2026 with the approved student intake, whereas their applications for transition to ITEP for the upcoming academic sessions have been refused.
- Further, as stated in the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Amendment Regulations, 2014 dated 25.01.2024, as further amended vide Gazette Notification dated 03.07.2025, the 4-year B.Sc. B.Ed./B.A. B.Ed. programme shall be discontinued from the academic session 2026–2027, and no fresh admissions shall be allowed to any institution conducting the 4-year integrated B.Sc. B.Ed./B.A. B.Ed. programme under the omitted Appendix-13.
- The Committee also discussed the order of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi dated 11.02.2026.

In view of the above, the Committee decided that the recognition of the aforesaid 6 petitioner institutions for the 4-year Integrated B.A. B.Ed. programme stands restored in compliance with the Court's order and the decision taken by NRC in its 453rd meeting held on 11th and 12th December, 2025 is hereby set aside.

Accordingly, the names of the Teacher Education Institutions may be published on the official website of NCTE in the list of recognized institutions.
