The online file of the institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act, 1993, Rules, Regulations, SOP, guidelines issued from time to time were placed before the Northern Regional Committee and the Committee noted the following: -

- **As per online application, the institution has applied for grant of recognition for B.Ed. course of Two year duration with an annual intake of 424 students.**
- **The First SCN was issued to the institution on 20/01/2023 on the following grounds:**

(If the building of the institution is completed at the time of submission of application). In this regard certificate is not issued by the Competent Government Authority and instead of that institution has submitted this certificate on his letter head over the signature of the Chairman of the institution on online application and hard copy of the same is not attached.
- xvii. Building Completion Certificate is submitted by the institution on their letter head (vide No. 1/ACE/132/20 dated 29.08.2020) over the signature of Chairman of the institution, which is not acceptable as NCTE Regulations, 2014.

- The matter of the institution was placed before NRC in its 392nd Meeting held on 09th & 10th February 2023. The Committee considered the matter and decided to issue Final Show Cause Notice to the institution
- Accordingly, Final Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution on 14.02.2023.
- The institution has not uploaded the reply to Final SCN.
- The matter was placed before NRC in its 429th meeting held on 25/10/2024 and the Committee decided that all 140 institutions of J&K and Ladakh be given a final opportunity to update their applications/ documents already submitted by them online on portal, pertaining to the development and preparedness done by them in terms of NCTE (Recognition, Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014 as amended from time to time. Accordingly the portal was opened from 05th Nov 2024 to 17th Nov 2024, for the institutions giving them the final opportunity regarding updation of reply/ representation, already submitted in respect of the TEI.
- The institution has uploaded / submitted reply on 15/11/2024 but no documentary proof in respect of deficiencies pointed out in first SCN was uploaded by the institution. The deficiencies of first SCN is as above, (i to xvii).
- The matter of the institution/ reply to Final Show Cause Notice uploaded by institution was considered by NRC in its 430th (Vol-2) Meeting held on 28th & 29th November 2024 and the Committee decided to reject/ refused the application of the institution.

Decision of the NRC is as below: -

“The online file of the institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act, 1993, Rules, Regulations, SOP, guidelines issued from time to time were placed before the Northern Regional Committee and the Committee observed the following:-

- First Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution vide email dated 20/01/2023.*
- The institution had not uploaded the reply of first show cause notice. Accordingly, final show cause notice was issued to the institution on 14/02/2023.*
- The institution again did not upload the reply to Final SCN. Accordingly, the matter was placed before NRC in its 429th meeting held on 25/10/2024 and the Committee, in pursuance of the decision taken by General Body of the Council in its 61st meeting held on 15/08/2024, decided that all 140 institutions of J&K and Ladakh be given a final opportunity to update their applications/ documents already submitted by them online on portal, pertaining to the development and preparedness done by them in terms of NCTE (Recognition, Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014 as amended from time to time. Subsequently, the portal was opened from 05th to 17th November 2024 for the institutions giving them final opportunity regarding updation of reply/ representation, already submitted in respect of the TEI.*

- iv. *The institution has uploaded the reply on 15.11.2024. In view of the above, the Committee concluded that the application of the institution is still deficient on the following grounds:-*
- v. *Certified copy of land documents in the name of society / institution not submitted. The institution was required to submit the Certified copy of all land documents issued by the Competent Revenue Authority.*
- vi. *PAN/GST/TAN No. are not mentioned by the institution in the online application.*
- vii. *Copy of Registration Certificate of the Trust has not been submitted. The photocopy of Trust Deed submitted is not legible.*
- viii. *A copy of permission for land use or Land Use Certificate issued by the competent authority has not been submitted by the institution.*
- ix. *A copy of mutation certificate issued by the competent authority has not been submitted by the institution.*
- x. *A copy of Non encumbrance certificate issued by the competent authority has not been submitted by the institution.*
- xi. *The institution was required to submit the Blue Print of the Building plan duly approved by the Competent Authority duly mentioning the name and location (Sy.No./Plot No./Khasra No.) of the institution, total land area, built up area, earmarked area for each course, date of approval and approving authority.*
- xii. *Site plan of the building approved by the Competent Government Authority has not been submitted.*

(If the building of the institution is completed at the time of submission of application). In this regard certificate is not issued by the Competent Government Authority and instead of that institution has submitted this certificate on his letter head with the signature of the Chairman of the institution on online application.*
- xv. *Building Completion Certificate has been submitted by the institution on their letter head (vide No. 1/ACE/132/20 dated 29.08.2020) under the signature of Chairman of the institution, which is not acceptable as NCTE Regulations, 2014. Hence, the Committee decided to reject/refuse the application for B.Ed. course of the institution on the grounds mentioned above under Section 14 of the NCTE Act 1993. Accordingly, the institution is not allowed to take admission from the academic session 2025-26.*

- **Accordingly, Refusal Order was issued to the institution on 07.01.2025.**
- **The institution has preferred an appeal before Appeal Committee, NCTE. The Appeal Committee vide order dated 24.06.2025 was confirmed the Refusal order 07.01.2025 issued by NRC to the institution. (Copy attached)**

Decision part of the Appeal Committee/ order is as under: -

“After perusal of the Appeal Report, documents on record and oral arguments advanced during the online hearing, Appeal Committee of the Council concludes that the instant

appeal lacks merit and accordingly rejects the appeal. The impugned order dated 07.01.2025 issued by NRC is hereby confirmed."

- **The institution has filed a writ petition No. WP (C) 960/2026 CM 2508/2026 before the High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh. The Hon'ble Court has passed an order dated 06.05.2026.**

The operative part of the order is as follows-

"The Hon'ble Court has directed that the petitioner college is directed to approach the respondents afresh with all requisite documents, along with details of the infrastructure required for recognition and affiliation of the petitioner-college for running the B.Ed. programme. Upon such submission, the respondents University of Kashmir and Council (NCTE) shall consider all documents produced by the petitioner college and undertake a fresh consideration of the matter, within a period of four weeks from the date a detailed representation along with supporting documents is submitted before them."

Upon proper examination of the matter and after due deliberation and in compliance of the Hon'ble Court's order, the Committee decided to forward the case to the Appeal Committee of NCTE for further consideration and examination of the representation along with supporting documents, if any, submitted by the petitioner-institution, or alternatively, it may provide an opportunity of hearing to the petitioner-institution in compliance with the Order of the Hon'ble Court.

 - x. Site map uploaded on website is in regional language. Translated version of the same is required to be submitted.
 - xi. Photocopy of Building Safety Certificate dated 14.12.2017 issued by the Executive Engineer, PWD submitted, valid for one year. Renewed Building Safety Certificate requires to be submitted.
 - xii. Fire Safety Certificate issued by the competent government authority not submitted.
 - xiii. Photocopy of certificate to the effect that the institution's campus, building, facility etc is disabled friendly is issued by the Principal of the college submitted. It is required to submit the same issued by the Competent Govt Authority.
 - xiv. Photocopy of Building Completion certificate dated 28.06.2020 submitted by the institution but seal of the approving authority not clear. The institution is required to submit the approved Building Completion Certificate signed by the Competent Govt. Authority indicating the name of the course, name of the institution, Khasra No./Plot No., total land area, total built-up area and the measurements of the Multi-purpose Hall as well as the other infrastructural facilities such as class rooms etc.
- The institution has not uploaded the reply to First SCN issued to the institution.
 - Accordingly, Final SCN was issued to the institution on 14/02/2023.
 - The institution has not uploaded the reply to Final SCN.
 - The matter was placed before NRC in its 429th meeting held on 25/10/2024 and the Committee decided that all 140 institutions of J&K and Ladakh be given a final

Accordingly the portal was opened from 05th Nov 2024 to 17th Nov 2024, for the institutions giving them the final opportunity regarding updation of reply/ representation, already submitted in respect of the TEI.


- Observation of Office: The institution has submitted reply on 16/11/2024 but nothing has been mentioned on the deficiencies pointed out by NRC. The column towards reply / representation of the institution is blank nor any document has been uploaded along with the reply.
- The NRC in its 431st Meeting (Vol.-1) held from 9th to 11th December 2024 and decided as under:-

“The online file of the institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Rules, NCTE Regulations 2014, SOP, guidelines issued from time to time were placed before the Northern Regional Committee and the Committee decided that VT be constituted in order to ascertain & scrutinize all the essential documents such as land documents, building plan, CLU, BCC, Non-Encumbrance Certificate along with other required documents in original and verify its authenticity with reference to NCTE Regulations 2014 and mention the status/position of these documents along with deficiencies, if any.

In addition, the VT shall also verify the infrastructure and instructional facilities created by the institution so as to assess its preparedness for running the course as per provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 as amended from time to time.”

- **VT constituted, and the Visiting Team members Visited the institution on 31.01.2025 and Report uploaded by Visiting Team Members was considered by NRC in its 436th (Vol -2) Meeting held on 20th & 21st March 2025 and decided to issued First SCN to the institution.**
- **As per decision of NRC taken in its 436th (Vol -2) meeting First SCN post inspection was issued to the institution on 23/04/2025. The institution has uploaded reply of First SCN post inspection on 07/05/2025 was considered by NRC in its 441st (Vol-1) Meeting held on 21st & 22nd May 2025 and the Committee decided to reconstitute the VT.**

- **The VT reconstituted, and the Visiting Team Members Visited the institution on 14.06.2025 and uploaded the report on the portal was considered by NRC in its 443rd (Vol-2) Meeting held on 09th & 10th July, 2025 and decided to issue Show Cause Notice Post Inspection to the institution.**
- Accordingly, SCN Post inspection was issued to the institution on 07.08.2025 and the institution has uploaded the reply to the SCN Post inspection on 12.08.2025.
- The NRC in its 445th (Vol-2) meeting held on 18th to 20th August 2025 was considered the reply to the SCN Post inspection and decided as under:-

“...As per the decision of NRC, the SCN Post Inspection was issued to the institution on 07/08/2025. The institution has uploaded a reply to the SCN Post Inspection on 12/08/2025. However, the same is still deficient on the following grounds:

- *The institution was not prepared properly for inspection. Due to poor coordination, the VT members could not verify the infrastructure and instructional facilities of the institution.*
- *The institution campus does not have accessible features like functional ramp, barrier free environment & toilet for differently abled persons.*
- *The institution has not uploaded the latest Non-encumbrance Certificate and Land Use Certificate.*

Hence, the Committee decided to reject/refuse the application for Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) degree of the institution on the grounds mentioned above under Section 14/15 (3)(b) of the NCTE Act 1993.”

- **Accordingly, Refusal Order was issued to the institution on 23.09.2025.**

The Committee has carefully examined the entire judgment and deliberated upon the matter with due diligence. Upon consideration of the legal and regulatory framework governing the functioning of the NCTE, it has been decided that an Appeal may be preferred against the said judgment, as grant of temporary recognition to an institution whose application for recognition has already been refused does not appear to be in consonance with the provisions of the NCTE Rules and Regulations.

- Accordingly, Recognition order was issued to the institution on 29.08.2025 for One Unit (50 Students.) followed by the Corrigendum to continuation of recognition was issued to the institution on 04.09.2025 for One Unit (50 Students).
- The institution has filed appeal before NCTE, appeal Committee for increase the intake from 50 seats (one unit to 100 seats (Two units)).
- The appeal Committee, NCTE vide appeal Order dated 15.01.2026 has confirmed the order / Corrigendum dated 03/04. 09. 2025 issued by NRC.

The decision part of the appeal order is as under:-

“After perusal of the Appeal Report, documents on record, and the oral arguments advanced during the online hearing, the Appeal Committee of the Council concluded that the appeal filed by the Appellant Institution lacks merit, that the NRC was justified in granting recognition for only one basic unit, and that the instant appeal seeking enhancement of seats deserves to be dismissed. Accordingly, the impugned Corrigendum dated 03.09.2025 issued by the NRC is confirmed.”

The petitioners filed W.P. No. 6303/2026 before the Hon'ble Court stating that the NCTE granted recognition for only one unit of the B.Ed. course and did not provide any reason for rejecting the application for the second unit.

After hearing the matter, the Hon'ble Court disposed of the writ petition with a direction to the respondents to treat the writ petition as a representation and to consider and decide the same by passing a reasoned and speaking order within four weeks from the date of the order. The operative portion of the court order is read out as below :

‘The present petition is disposed of with a direction upon the respondents to treat this petition as a representation and decide the same by passing a reasoned and speaking order within four weeks from today. The petitioners are at liberty to take steps against the said order, if required. If the respondents require any clarification or any further documents to be submitted, it will inform the petitioners, and the petitioners will be provided with an opportunity to supply the documents for clarification.’

The Committee considered the matter of Galaxy College of Education, Jammu, which had applied for recognition of B.Ed. course with an intake of 100 students. The Committee noted that the institution was issued LOI on 26.05.2025 and the reply submitted by the institution was considered by NRC in its 445th Meeting held from 18th to 20th August 2025. Thereafter, recognition was granted for one unit only i.e. 50 students, vide order dated 29.08.2025 followed by corrigendum dated 04.09. 2025. The Committee further noted that the institution filed an appeal before the Appeal Committee, NCTE for enhancement of intake from 50 seats to 100 seats. The Appeal Committee, vide order dated 15.01.2026, upheld the decision of NRC and dismissed the appeal.

It was also noted that the institution thereafter filed W.P. No. 6303/2026 before the Hon’ble Court. The Hon’ble Court vide order dated 08.05.2026 directed the respondents to treat the writ petition as a representation and pass a reasoned and speaking order within four weeks.

After detailed deliberations and in compliance of the Hon’ble Court order, the Committee decided that a letter may be issued to the institution highlighting the deficiencies. The institution be asked to submit a complete faculty list approved by the Affiliating University in the prescribed format , as per the NCTE Norms and Regulations along with relevant documents within a period of 07 days. On receipt of the required information/documents, the representation of the institution shall be considered and decided in a time-bound manner in compliance with the Hon’ble Court order dated 08.05.2026.

Order shall be issued accordingly.

The online file of the institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act, 1993, Rules, Regulations, SOP, guidelines issued from time to time were placed before the Northern Regional Committee and the Committee noted the following: -

1. The institution had submitted an application to the NRC of NCTE for grant recognition/permission to the institution namely, **Sai Baba Sansthan, Village – Baduhi (Raja Ka Bagh), Post – Nagabari, Tehsil – Nurpur, District – Kangra, Himachal Pradesh – 176025** for D.Ed. Course in the office on NRC on 26.06.2008.
2. The deficiency letter was issued to the society namely, **A One Educational Society** on 21.07.2008. The reply dated 26.08.2008 submitted by the **President, Shri Sai Baba Welfare Education Society** in compliance of deficiencies, the following essential documents still need more clarification from the institution: -

- *Approved Building Plan*
- *Affidavit on Rs. 100/- Stamp paper*
- *Land Use Conversion Certificate (CLU)*

Accordingly, clarification letter was issued to the institution namely, **Shri Sai Baba Sansthan** on 20.01.2009.

3. A One Educational Society submitted representation vide letter dated 03.02.2009 received in NRC office on on 03.02.2009 stating that *“I want to change the name of college **SHRI SAI BABA SANSTHAN** to **A ONE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION**. Because of the name mentioned above SHRI SAI BABA SANSTHAN is related to the religious concern so that it is being objectionable so that i want to change it. You may kindly note and for that purpose I am submitting the 10 Rs. Affidavit in this purpose. You are requested to please make all the correspondent in the name of **A ONE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION**.”*
4. A One Educational Society also submitted reply of compliance of deficiencies and the matter was considered by the NRC in its 139th meeting held on 10th April to 12th April, 2009 and the Committee **recommended that the LOI for inspection is to be issued.**

Further, the Land is to be registered in the name of Institution within 90 days.

Accordingly, letter was issued to the Institution namely, **Sai A One College of Education** on 30.04.2009

5. The society namely, **A One Educational Society** has submitted reply of Letter of Intent received in the NRC office on 05.06.2009.
6. Inspection of the institution was conducted on 01.08.2009 and the Visiting Team Report was received in NRC office on 07.08.2009

7. The matter was placed before NRC in its 148th meeting held from 28th to 30th August, 2009 and the Committee decided as under:-

The original file of the institution, VTR under section 14 of the Institution along with all other related documents, Act of NCTE, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines of NCTE published from time to time were considered by the committee and the committee observes the following:

- Total constructed area is not more than 750 sq. m which is not as per NCTE norms for ETT / D.Ed.
- Actual space is not as per approved building plan.
- The land is not in the name of the Institution.
- All books available in the library are for B.Ed. course but not D.Ed. / ETT.
- The physical and instructional facilities indicate that the Institute is not ready to start ETT / D.Ed. course.
- Eleven computers are not enough for students of all courses.
- E-learning facilities are not available.
- Different labs are ill equipped.
- The Management suppressed the information regarding running B.Ed. Course.
- The titles of books in the library are not as per NCTE norms for D.Ed. / ETT.

Hence, the committee decides to issue Show Cause Notice on the above points and directs the Institution to reply within 21 days.

Accordingly, Show Cause Notice was issued on 31.08.2009 and the reply from the institution was received in NRC on 18.09.2009.

8. The matter was placed before NRC in its 150th meeting held from 09th to 11th October, 2009 and the Committee decided as under:-

“The original file of the institution, Reply of the Institution along with all other related documents, Act of NCTE, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines of NCTE published from time to time were considered by the committee and the Committee decides to conduct inspection of the institution for verification of facts. The institution will be asked to deposit Rs.40,000/- as inspection fees.”

Accordingly, letter was issued to the institution on 28.10.2009.

Decision of 55th GB meeting of NCTE is as follows:

- I. **At present, there are several institutions which have been recognized by the Regional Committees of NCTE wherein Diploma level courses/programmes are running. An Expert Committee be constituted to devise the modalities for**

conversion of these recognized institutions into multidisciplinary institutions in line with NEP 2020.

- II. **The applications pending before the RCs for the said Diploma level course(s) shall not be processed further. Hence, all such pending applications before RCs at any stage of processing be returned along with the processing fee to the concerned institution(s).**
- III. **In the cases where the applications for 2 year Diploma level course (s) are being processed/re-opened as per the directions of the Hon'ble Court (s), the concerned Regional Committee shall file a review/appeal before the Hon'ble court(s) alongwith stay application against the order passed by the Hon'ble Court(s) for processing of application(s) in view of the decision of the Council as taken in II above.**

After proper examination and due diligence of the application seeking re-inspection along with the reminders submitted before the office of NRC-NCTE, the Committee observed that the said application for re-inspection is considerably old and, in view of the decisions and regulatory framework adopted pursuant to the 55th GB Meeting of NCTE, the request for re-inspection cannot be processed at this stage.

Accordingly, the Committee decided that a reasoned and speaking order be issued to the institute. It was further decided that the Demand Draft amounting to Rs. 40,000/- submitted by the institution towards re-inspection fee be returned to the concerned institution in light of the decisions taken in the 55th GB Meeting.

Order shall be issued accordingly.

Decision of NRC

The Committee considered the matter relating to the writ petition titled *Seema vs. State of Haryana & Ors.*, wherein the petitioner has challenged denial of benefits under the 3rd ACP Scheme on the ground of non-fulfilment of the eligibility condition of securing 50% marks in 10+2 examination.

The Committee took note of the submissions made by the Standing Counsel for Punjab & Haryana, Mr. Karan Bir Gill, vide email dated 21.05.2026, informing that the matter was last listed on 15.05.2026 and that the Hon'ble Court directed NCTE to file a reply along with costs of Rs 25,000/- with additional costs for every delay imposed in the matter.

The Committee further observed that NRC-NCTE has been impleaded only as a pro forma respondent and that no substantive relief has been sought against NCTE in the present service matter. It was also noted that adverse orders, including imposition of costs of Rs.

25,000/-, were passed due to unauthorized submissions allegedly made by the erstwhile panel counsel, Mr. Ranjit Singh Kalra, without formal instructions from NCTE.

After detailed deliberations, the Committee decided as under:

- 1. No affidavit/reply is not required to be filed on behalf of the NRC-NCTE in the said matter, considering its pro forma status in the proceedings.**
- 2. The Standing Counsel may make limited oral submissions before the Hon'ble Court, if required, regarding the limited role of NRC-NCTE in the present case.**
- 3. The Hon'ble Court may also be apprised, on the next date of hearing, regarding the unauthorized submissions allegedly made by the former panel counsel, Mr. Ranjit Singh Kalra, which resulted in imposition of costs upon NRC-NCTE.**

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
