**The NRC Considered the application of the institution and found the same deficient on the following grounds: -**

- The institution has neither submitted any evidence to prove that it is a multidisciplinary institution **in relevant subjects** as per sub-regulation 2(ca) of NCTE Regulations, 2014 as amended *vide* Gazette Notification dated 26.10.2021 nor it has applied under the category of Merger/ Collaboration as per the Guidelines issued by NCTE for Transforming NCTE Recognized Stand-Alone Teacher Education Institutions into Multidisciplinary Higher Education Institutions.

**Hence, the Committee, in view of the Public Notice dated 12.09.2025 issued by NCTE, decided to summarily reject/refuse the application for B.A. B.Ed. Secondary (1 unit) & B.Sc. B.Ed. Secondary (1 unit) of the institution on the grounds mentioned above under Section 14/15 (3) (b) of the NCTE Act 1993.**

Mr. Sharawat, learned senior counsel for the petitioner, states that a refusal order dated 25.11.2025 issued by the respondent No. 2, whereby application of the petitioner for transition of its B.A.B. ED./B.SC. B.ED. course to ITEP has been rejected. He further states that the impugned order has been passed without following the procedure laid down in Proviso to sub-Section (3)(b) of Section 14 of The National Council for Teacher Education Act, 1993 (‘NCTE Act’), which provides that before passing any order under sub-Clause (b), the Regional Committee shall provide a reasonable opportunity to the concerned institution for making a written representation. It is urged that at this stage, the Petitioner will be satisfied if a direction is issued to the Respondents to issue a show cause notice and give an opportunity to the Petitioner to make a representation.		
3.	For the said reasons, issue notice.		
4.	Mr. Kapoor, learned counsel accepts notice on behalf of the respondents and draws my attention to the fact that the present dispute is covered by the Order dated 19.01.2026 passed by this Court in a similar matter titled as “Dpm College & Anr. v. National Council for Teacher Education & Anr., W.P.(C) 722/2026”.		
5.	Mr. Kapoor on instructions, states that the impugned order does not reflect that opportunity was afforded to the petitioner to represent before the impugned order was passed, which is a mandate of Section 14(3)(b).		
6.	The detailed Orders have already been passed in similar matters covering this dispute. However, in order to ensure complete clarity, they are reiterated hereinbelow.

Perusal of the refusal order dated 25.11.2025 does not indicate compliance of Proviso to sub-section (3)(b) of Section 14 of NCTE Act. Clearly, the impugned order is in violation of the mandatory statutory provision and cannot be sustained on this short ground.</i></p>			
<p><b>8. In view of the above, without examining the merits of the deficiencies noted in the impugned order, the writ petition is allowed to the limited extent of setting aside the order dated 25.11.2025 on the ground of violation of principles of natural justice.</b></p>

#### Decision of NRC

The online file of the institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, NCTE Rules 1997, NCTE Regulations 2014, Standards Operating Procedure (SoP) & Guidelines issued by NCTE (HQ) from time to time were placed before the Northern Regional Committee and the Committee observed the following: -

- During the year 2019, it came to the notice of NCTE that some prospective employers prior to employing a person as a teacher; were required verification of recognition status from NCTE regarding degree/diploma/ certificate in teacher education. Hence, NCTE decided to facilitate candidates who had passed out of teacher education programmes from NCTE recognized institution. Teacher-pupils undergoing, or already passed out, from any NCTE recognized teacher education programme in India may visit the NCTE website at an icon namely Online Teacher Registration Management System (OTRMS) for registration. In this regard, NCTE issued Public Notice dated 26.07.2019 and the certificate(s) are being issued since then.
- OTRMS serves as a centralized, digital repository to maintain authenticated records of all candidates who have successfully completed NCTE-recognized teacher education programs. The certificate acts as an authentic document verifying that a candidate's teacher training institute and degree comply with NCTE standards. It is increasingly requested by recruitment boards and state education departments during teacher appointments. The NCTE has linked OTRMS certificates with Digi Locker. This allows educators to easily access and present their verified credentials digitally.

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- The OTPRMS certificate is intended to function as a digital verification document. However, the practice of requiring all applicants to submit OTPRMS certificates at the initial stages of recruitment, dossier filing, and document verification has resulted in an unprecedented volume of applications. This has led to delays in the issuance of certificates, overcrowding of requests, and increased administrative burden on NCTE. Consequently, a system designed to operate through a seamless digital interface is increasingly assuming the characteristics of a physical verification process, thereby undermining the objective of efficient and technology-driven service delivery.

The Committee considered the matter in detail and noted that the Online Teacher-Pupil Registration Management System (OTPRMS) was introduced by NCTE to facilitate verification of teacher education qualifications and to maintain an authenticated digital repository of candidates who have completed teacher education programmes from NCTE-recognised institutions. The Committee further observed that OTPRMS certificates are increasingly being sought by various recruiting agencies and education departments during recruitment processes.

The Committee observed that requiring all applicants to obtain OTPRMS certificates at the initial stage of recruitment results in avoidable hardship to candidates and places a substantial administrative burden on NCTE. Accordingly, the Committee was of the view that verification of teacher education qualifications may be undertaken only in respect of candidates who have qualified and are under consideration for final selection.

With a view to improving the efficiency, transparency, and authenticity of the verification process, the Committee decided that State recruiting agencies, including DSSSB and other similarly placed recruitment boards, may be advised to furnish consolidated lists of shortlisted/selected candidates, along with details of their teacher education qualifications, academic sessions, and institutions attended. Upon receipt of such information, NCTE shall verify the recognition status of the concerned Teacher Education Institutions (TEIs) and programmes from its official records and communicate the verification status directly to the concerned recruiting agency.

The Committee noted that such a mechanism would ensure reliable and timely verification, reduce hardship to candidates, prevent unnecessary visits to NCTE offices, optimize administrative resources, and maintain the integrity of the recruitment process.
