The 468th Meeting of the Northern Regional Committee (NRC), National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) was held on 22nd & 23rd July 2026 in Hybrid mode at NCTE Office, New Delhi under the Chairmanship of the Chairperson of NRC Committee. 2. At the outset, the Regional Director and Convener, NRC, welcomed the Chairperson and all the Members. She apprised the Committee of the work undertaken by the Office of the NRC in pursuance of the directions issued by the NCTE Headquarters from time to time. 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The file of the institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act, 1993, Rules, Regulations, SOP, guidelines issued from time to time were placed before the Northern Regional Committee and the Committee observed the following: -

- Recognition was granted to the aforesaid institution for conducting D.El.Ed. course with an annual intake of 50 students (1 unit) vide Order No. F.NRC/NCTE/NRCAPP-9245,8217, 6885, 8461, 9321, 7320, 7967, 8006, 8006, 8045, 7185, 7905, 6837, 8740, 1648, 189, 628 & 8010/238th Meeting (Part-VI)/109541-61 dated 31.05.2015.
- The Committee found that a corrigendum letter bearing No. NRC/NCTE/NRCAPP-7320/239th Meeting/2015/118342-46 dated 09.07.2015 for increasing annual intake from one unit to two units for offering D.El.Ed. course was attached in the institution file. The Committee sought the records of despatch diary along with other relevant records and concluded that the corrigendum order was fake and found that the order was also uploaded on NRC website with *mala fide* intention.
- The matter was placed before NRC its 439th meeting held on 05th & 06th May 2025 and the Committee decided that Show Cause Notice be issued to the institution. Accordingly, Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution 02.06.2025.
- The matter was further placed before NRC its 444th Meeting held from 24th & 25th July 2025, and the Committee decided to withdraw the recognition to the institution for offering D.El.Ed. course. Accordingly, Withdrawal Order was issued to the institution on 10.09.2025.
- The institution filed an appeal under Section 18 of NCTE Act 1993 against the withdrawal order dated 10.09.2025 and the Appellate Authority vide its order No. 89-33/E-396568/2026 Appeal/7th Meeting, 2026 APPLNRC202615506 dated **02.06.2026** remanded the case back to NRC with the following decision: -

"After careful consideration of the Appeal Report, the impugned order, the records available on file and the submissions made by the appellant institution, the Appeal Committee of the Council, in exercise of appellate jurisdiction under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993, decided to remand the matter to the Northern Regional Committee (NRC) for limited factual verification and regulatory reassessment. Accordingly, the impugned order dated 10.09.2026 shall remain kept in abeyance until the NRC takes an appropriate decision after due examination of the submissions of the appellant institution and verification of relevant facts from the affiliating body/competent authority, strictly in accordance with the provisions of the NCTE Act, 1993 Rules and the NCTE Regulations, 2014, as amended."

In view of the above, the Committee decided for limited factual verification and regulatory reassessment of the recognition granted to the institution for offering D.El.Ed. course. Also, number of units offered by the institution from the date of grant of affiliation to till date be obtained from SCERT, UP.

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After examination of the submissions of the appellant institution and verification of relevant facts from the affiliating body, a detailed agenda be placed before NRC in its ensuing meeting for further decision in the matter and thereafter, onward submission of the report to the Appellate Authority accordingly.

The file of the institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act, 1993, Rules, Regulations, SOP, guidelines issued from time to time were placed before the Northern Regional Committee and the Committee observed the following: -

- Recognition was granted to the aforesaid institution for conducting B.Ed. course vide Order No. NRC/NCTE/F-7/UP-2024/148th Meeting/2009/9710-9716 dated 31.08.2009 with an annual intake of 100 seats from the academic session 2009-2010 followed by revised recognition order with an annual intake of two units (100 students) vide Order NRC/NCTE/UP-2024/2015/145126-31 dated 08.04.2016.
- A complaint was received in NRC office on 06.03.2019 against the aforesaid institution for necessary action.
- The matter was placed before NRC its 365th (Vol-II) (Blended Mode) Meeting held on 08th & 9th March, 2022 and the Committee decided to **withdraw the recognition** to the institution. Accordingly, Withdrawal Order was issued to the institution on 19.07.2022.
- The matter was again considered by NRC in compliance of W.P. (C) No. 12339/2021 and CC No. 748/2022 and decided that the withdrawal Order 19.07.2022 be modified to the extent the recognition of the institution be withdrawn from the end of the academic session next following the date of communication of withdrawal Order. Accordingly, letter was issued to the institution concerned, affiliating body and the State Govt. vide No. NRC/NCTE/UP-2024-B.Ed./372nd Emergent Meeting (Blended Mode) Meeting/2022/218908-915 dated 18.08.2022.
- The institution had filed Cont. Case (C) No. 1037/2022 before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and the Hon'ble Court passed an Order dated 28/09/2022 with the following direction: -

❖ *It is submitted by Ms. Kaul, learned counsel for the respondents, that a clarificatory communication will be issued by the respondents clarifying that the withdrawal order dated 19.07.2022 would take effect from the end of the Academic session 2023-2024 and that the petitioner would,*

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		therefore be entitled to participate in counselling and admit students for the Academic Session 2022-23 and 2023-24. She further submits that the same will be issued as expeditiously as possible, and in any event, within one week from today. ❖ The said clarification/communication be uploaded by the respondent on the website within a period of one week from today. ❖ In view of the above, no further directions are required to be passed in the present petition and the same is accordingly, disposed of. • The matter was placed before NRC its 380th (Blended mode) Meeting held on 08th October 2022, and the Committee decided that the withdrawal order dated 19/07/2022 would take effect from the end of the Academic Session 2023-2024. • The institution further filed an appeal under Section 18 of NCTE Act 1993 against the withdrawal order dated 19.07.2022 and the Appellate Authority passed an Order No. 89-63/E-345690/2024 Appeal/02nd Meeting, 2025 APPLNRC202314814 dated 12.03.2025 remanding the case back to NRC with the following decision: - <i>“After perusal of the Appeal Report, documents on record and oral arguments advanced during the online hearing, Appeal Committee of the Council concluded to remand back the case to NRC with a direction to verify the documents submitted in Appeal from the concerned affiliating University. The Appellant institution is directed to forward to the NRC the documents submitted in appeal within 15 days from the receipt of order of the Appeal and after receipt of the same the NRC to take further necessary action as per the NCTE Regulation, 2014, guidelines and amendments issued from time to time as per direction given herein above.”</i> • The institution has not submitted any document in compliance with Appeal Order. In view of the above, the Committee considered the facts and documents related to the case and decided to restore the recognition granted to the institution for offering B.Ed. course of two-year duration with an annual intake of 100 students i.e. two basic units of 50 students each. Further, the Committee decided to issue Show Cause Notice to the institution on the following grounds: - • The institution has not submitted any evidence to prove that it is a multidisciplinary institution as per NCTE Regulations, 2014 as amended from time to time.

		- The institution is required to submit the copies of the affiliation orders for the last three years issued by the affiliating body concerned for each course being offered by the institution. - The institution is required to submit the latest/ valid Fire Safety Certificate issued by the Competent Government Authority. - The institution is required to submit the certified copy of Registered Land Documents issued by the Competent Revenue Authority. - The institution is required to submit the Blueprint of approved Building Plan duly signed/approved by the Competent Govt. The online file of the institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, NCTE Rules 1997, NCTE Regulations 2014, Standards Operating Procedure (SoP) & Guidelines issued by NCTE (HQ) from time to time were placed before the Northern Regional Committee and the Committee observed the following: -

- ❖ As per the decision of NRC taken in its 466th Meeting held on 02nd June 2026, Final SCN After Preliminary Scrutiny was issued to the institution on 18.06.2026.

The Committee considered the matter and decided to reject the application on the institution on the following grounds: -

- The institution has not submitted the reply of Final SCN dated 18.06.026 issued to it.
- The institution is not a multidisciplinary institution in relevant subjects as per sub regulation 2(ca) of NCTE Regulations, 2014 as amended vide Gazette Notification dated 26.10.2021. The institution has stated that the requirement of MoC is no longer applicable as the institution is multidisciplinary institution and it is offering B.A. (yoga), Diploma (Yoga), Shiksha Shastri. However, these courses cannot be considered as multidisciplinary in relevant subjects.
- The building completion certificate uploaded by the institution is certified by the Sarpanch and not by the Competent Government Engineer.
- Certificate to the effect that the institution's campus, building, furniture etc. is barrier free/ accessible is issued by Regd. Structure Engineer (Design) and countersigned by Sarpanch. As such, the Certificate is not issued by the Competent Government Engineer.
- Building Safety Certificate issued by the Regd. Structure Engineer (Design) and countersigned by the Sarpanch. As such, the Certificate is not issued by the Competent Government Engineer.
- The certificate to the effect that the building of the institution has been constructed as per National Building Code and the same is fully safe and structurally sound having load bearing capacity as per the Code/ Standards, to run the teacher training course is issued by the Regd. Structural Engineer and certified by the Sarpanch. As such, the Certificate is not issued by the Competent Government Engineer.

- ❖ As per the decision of NRC taken in its 450th Meeting held on 08th November 2025, the application of the institution was refused on 25.11.2025 on the grounds mentioned therein.
- ❖ Against the refusal Order of NRC, the institution filed W.P.(C) No. 6107/2026 & CM APPL. 30011/2026 before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and the Hon'ble Court passed an Order dated May 05, 2026, as under: -

11. *In case there is any other deficiency, the same shall be communicated to the petitioner within 5 days from today.*

12. *Thereafter, the respondents shall pass a reasoned order in accordance with law within two weeks and communicate the same to the petitioner. It is clarified that the petitioner shall remain at liberty to avail appropriate legal remedies, if aggrieved by the decision so rendered.*

13. *This Court has not expressed any opinion on the merits of the case.*

14. *The present writ petition is disposed of along with pending applications, if any."*

The institution has uploaded a reply of SCN on 03.07.2026. The Committee considered the reply and found the same still deficient on the following grounds: - • Not for Profit Certificate from the Income Tax Department is not uploaded. • Exemption Certificate 12(A) from the income Tax Department is not uploaded. • Building Safety Certificate is signed by the Architect, Sarpanch, Block Development and Panchyat Officer. However, the Building Completion Certificate uploaded by the institution is not in the prescribed format of the NCTE. The institution is required to submit a Building Completion Certificate signed/approved by the Competent Government Authority in the prescribed format. • The institution has uploaded the building plan signed by the Architect, Sarpanch, Block Development and Panchyat Officer mentioning the plot Nos.136/16/17/2/1, 17/2/4, 24/2/1, 137/11/20/2/1 of total land area 12752.23 sq. mtrs. and covered area 6391.68 sq. mtrs. However, the earmarked area for different programmes being offered by the institution is not depicted in the building plan. The institution is required to create new infrastructure for the courses applied for. Accordingly, it shall upload the approved Blueprint of the Building Plan, duly signed/approved by the Competent Government Authority, at least of the level of Executive Engineer of the State Public Works Department (PWD) or an officer of equivalent rank/level in the concerned State. The Building Plan shall clearly indicate the name of the course(s), name of the institution, Khasra No./Plot No., total land area, total built-up area, dimensions of the Multi-purpose Hall, and details of other infrastructural facilities, along with the approval letter issued by the Competent Government Authority, in accordance with the Norms and Standards prescribed under the NCTE Regulations, 2014. The Building Plan should also clearly demarcate the area earmarked for the existing course(s) and the proposed course(s). • The institution has not submitted a certificate from the State Government of Haryana justifying the need for teacher education program in the area, as specified in clause 4.3 (1) of the NCTE Guidelines for Multi-disciplinary Higher Education institution. • The institution has not also submitted a certificate from the Competent Government Authority to the effect that both the institutions i.e. R.S. Memorial College of Education and Matic Degree College, Anta are situated within a radius of 10 km as required under clause 4.3(a) of the NCTE Guidelines for Multidisciplinary Higher Education Institution. Hence, the Committee decided that the Final Show Cause Notice be issued to the institution to submit reply on the deficiencies mentioned above within 7 days from the date of issue of this Show Cause Notice.

- ❖ The Visiting Team Report of the institution was considered by the Committee and the Committee noted that the institution is deficient on the following grounds: -
 - The institution is required to upload a Certificate as well as Nazri Naksha of the land signed by the Patwari or an officer of equivalent rank/level in the concerned State, duly countersigned by the Competent Revenue Authority (At least the level of Tehsildar or equivalent Officer) indicating that all the Khasra Nos. of land on which the institution is established, are adjacent to each other.
 - The institution is also required to upload geotagged photographs of the land signed by the Patwari or an officer of equivalent rank/level in the concerned State, duly countersigned by the Competent Revenue Authority (At least of the level of Tehsildar).
 - The institution is also required to upload geotagged photographs of the building of the institution signed by the Patwari or an officer of equivalent rank/level in the concerned State, duly countersigned by the Competent Revenue Authority (At least of the level of Tehsildar).
 - The institution has not submitted the No Objection Certificate for offering the proposed course(s) issued by the affiliating body.
 - At the main entrance of the institution, the board displayed reads "Janta Group of Institution", whereas the application submitted by the institution is in the name of "S.P.S. Janta College".
 - The website www.jantagroup.co.in mentioned by the institution which is currently non-functional.
 - The building shown during the inspection had the name "S.P.S. Janta College PG" written on it, which differs from the details provided in the online application form.

		- Multiple courses and multiple colleges are being operated within the same campus, making it impossible to verify the institution's address and its actual status. - In the same campus, B.Ed. and D.El.Ed. programmes recognized by NCTE are being conducted in one building, however, the institution concealed this fact in its online application. - The institution does not have an updated certificate of the Managing Society i.e. G.B.S. Education Society. During inspection, only a certificate issued in 2013 was presented, whereas under the Societies Registration Act, the certificate must be renewed after every 5 years. - During the online inspection, only 3 classrooms were shown for the proposed programme, which does not meet the Norms & Standards prescribed by NCTE. - The institution has purchased 600 books with 270 titles for the proposed programme, which is grossly inadequate as per Norms & Standards prescribed by NCTE. - During the online inspection, the institution could not show any Professional/Research/General journal of the year 2026 — only journals from 2024 and 2025 were shown. The institution also could not produce any documents related to journal subscriptions. - The Multipurpose Hall shown during the online inspection measured only 20×40 = 800 sq. ft., which is not sufficient as per Norms & Standards prescribed by NCTE. - The Science Stream Laboratories and Humanities Stream Laboratories measuring approximately 400 sq. ft. each, are not as per Norms & Standards prescribed by NCTE. - During the inspection, the institution attempted to mislead the Visiting Team (VT) members. A board reading "Geography Lab" was placed on one gate of a room, and a board reading "Boys Common Room" was placed on the second gate of the same room. In reality, there was only one room which is shown twice in different forms. - There is no toilet facility for people with disabilities (Divyangjan) in the institution. - In the building map submitted by the institution, the area designated for the institution is neither clearly marked nor are the relevant facts clearly stated in the Building Completion Certificate. - The level of preparedness of the institution is not upto the mark and many deficiencies are observed by the visiting team and therefore, approval cannot be granted for applied programme under ITEP Regulations. Hence, the Committee decided that Show Cause Notice post VT after order of Appellate Authority be issued to the institution to submit reply on the deficiencies mentioned

Which can be checked by the college Bank Statement and university records. - As per NCTE guidelines, college must have encumbrance certificate, but in this college, they have taken Loan on college Approx Rs. 1 crore (100,00,000 /-). - As per NCTE guidelines, the said college also does not have the Building Completion Certificate. - As per NCTE guidelines, the college must have a proper road to enter but there is no such road, as this college is situated in the middle of the village where there is only 5 feet passage to move. - As per NCTE guidelines, the college must have Fire NOC but that too is not available. - As per NCTE, CLU certificate is necessary, but they had submitted fake certificate which bears fake stamp. - As per NCTE guidelines, MAP of college is also not approved by municipal cooperation. - As per NCTE, no other activity can be done in college premises, but contrary to this, there is Buffalo tabala in college where they do milk farming business. - As per NCTE, no Society member can become principal, but in this college from last 10 to 15 years, one person (member of society) illegally has hold the post of Principal and that is also ignoring age criteria of 60 years. - The said college is running without having due compliance certificates and also bypass all the rules, regulation and guidelines framed by NCTE. Moreover, many of the illegal and unlawful activities are also running on the college campus. ❖ The matter was considered by NRC in its 433rd meeting (Volume-III) held on 30th & 31st January 2025, and the Committee decided to issue Show Cause Notice to the institution on the grounds mentioned therein. ❖ Accordingly, First Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution on 28.03.2025. The institution had submitted the reply on 16.04.2025 & 07.08.2025 received in NRC office on 08.06.2025. & 25.08.2025 respectively. ❖ As per the decision of NRC taken in its 454th (Volume-II) meeting held on 30th & 31st January 2026, Final Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution on 13/04/2026. The institution has submitted a reply to Final SCN on 15.05.2026. The Committee considered the reply and found the same deficient on the following grounds: - - The building plan submitted is approved by the Gram Panchayat and not by a Competent Government Engineer. - Non-Encumbrance Certificate submitted by the institution is issued by the Tehsildar on 19.03.2026, however, the period of search is not mentioned therein. - The Fire Safety Certificate submitted does not appear to be an authentic certificate.

As such, the institution has shifted its location without following due procedure and prior permission of NRC.

- NRC is in receipt of a letter No. F. Exam Cell/SCERT/Reply/2026/2026/3016 dated 18.06.2026 from Dr. Mukesh Yadav, Secretary, SCERT, Delhi stating the following
 - District Institute of Education and Training (DIET), presently functioning from Bhola Nath Nagar, Babu Ram Complex, Delhi-110032, was formerly situated at J & K Block, Dilshad Garden, Delhi-110095 from January 2020 to October 2022 and is currently undergoing the formal process of approving its institutional address in the official records of NCTE.
 - Government of NCT of Delhi declared the DIET Bhola Nath Nagar building unsafe & dangerous for D.EL.Ed. Student Teachers and directed the Institute to shift to the premises of DIET, J&K Block, Dilshad Garden, Delhi-110095. Consequently, all the academic and administrative activities of DIET, Bhola Nath Nagar were conducted from the Dilshad Garden premises from January 2010 to October 2022.
 - The State Council of Educational Research and Training, Delhi is the affiliating authority of DIET Bhola Nath Nagar, Delhi. The matter concerning the address discrepancy was duly examined by SCERT, Delhi and subsequently was considered by the Committee.
- The institution and the SCERT requested the NRC to consider above matter in the interest of thousands of trainees of DIET, Bhola Nath Nagar, Delhi in particular and public interest in general so that no trainee suffers any academic, financial, or professional loss due to this technical discrepancy.

The Committee deliberated the issue at length and decided that being a government institution, the change in address of the institution is allowed for OPTRMS purpose only as a very special case in the interest of students and the same may not be quoted as a precedent in future seeking similar sort of relief by other institutions.
