- In this regard, it is pertinent to note that the institution has remained non-functional since the academic year 2021-2022 and has not conducted any academic activities for a continuous period of approximately five to six academic years. In such circumstances, the question of restoration of recognition cannot be examined in a mechanical or routine manner. Rather, it necessitates a thorough and objective assessment of the present factual and functional status of the institution, particularly about the availability of duly qualified teaching faculty, infrastructural facilities, and other essential requirements mandated under the NCTE Act and Regulations.
- Accordingly, the Committee, as a matter of prudence and in discharge of its statutory obligations, decided to call upon the institution to furnish, inter alia, the latest list of teaching faculty duly approved by the Director, SCERT, Andhra Pradesh, along with documentary proof of compliance with all requisite infrastructural and instructional facilities. This requirement is not merely procedural but goes to the very essence of ensuring that the institution is in a position to impart quality teacher education in accordance with prescribed standards.
- However, it is a matter of serious concern that, till date, the institution has failed to submit the aforesaid mandatory documents, including the duly approved latest faculty list. Such continued non-compliance reflects a lack of diligence and raises substantial doubts regarding the institution's preparedness and capability to resume academic activities in conformity with regulatory norms and standards.
- In this context, it is respectfully submitted that the issuance of any restoration order in the absence of verified compliance with essential requirements—particularly with regard to qualified teaching faculty and requisite infrastructure and instructional facilities—would be wholly untenable in law and contrary to the spirit and objectives of the NCTE Act and the Regulations framed thereunder. Any such action would not only undermine the regulatory framework but also seriously jeopardize the academic interests and future prospects of the students who may be admitted pursuant to such restoration.
- It is further emphasized that permitting the institution to operate without ensuring strict compliance would expose students to substandard educational conditions, thereby adversely affecting their professional competence and future employability. This, in turn, would have far-reaching consequences for the quality of education and would be detrimental to the larger public interest and national development.
- In view of the above, it is clear that mere compliance with the directions of the Hon'ble Court, without due verification of statutory and regulatory compliance, would not serve the intended purpose of the NCTE Act, Rules and Regulations. The regulatory authority is duty-bound to ensure that all mandatory requirements are fulfilled in letter and spirit before granting or restoring recognition, and any deviation from this settled principle would be

Any such action would not only undermine the regulatory framework but also seriously jeopardize the academic interests and future prospects of the students who may be admitted pursuant to such restoration.
- It is further emphasized that permitting the institution to operate without ensuring strict compliance would expose students to substandard educational conditions, thereby adversely affecting their professional competence and future employability. This, in turn, would have far-reaching consequences for the quality of education and would be detrimental to the larger public interest and national development.

Such continued non-compliance reflects a lack of diligence and raises substantial doubts regarding the institution's preparedness

and capability to resume academic activities in conformity with regulatory norms and standards.

- In this context, it is respectfully submitted that the issuance of any restoration order in the absence of verified compliance with essential requirements—particularly with regard to qualified teaching faculty and requisite infrastructure and instructional facilities—would be wholly untenable in law and contrary to the spirit and objectives of the NCTE Act and the Regulations framed thereunder. Any such action would not only undermine the regulatory framework but also seriously jeopardize the academic interests and future prospects of the students who may be admitted pursuant to such restoration.
- It is further emphasized that permitting the institution to operate without ensuring strict compliance would expose students to substandard educational conditions, thereby adversely affecting their professional competence and future employability. This, in turn, would have far-reaching consequences for the quality of education and would be detrimental to the larger public interest and national development.
- In view of the above, it is clear that mere compliance with the directions of the Hon'ble Court, without due verification of statutory and regulatory compliance, would not serve the intended purpose of the NCTE Act and Regulations. The regulatory authority is duty-bound to ensure that all mandatory requirements are fulfilled in letter and spirit before granting or restoring recognition, and any deviation from this settled principle would be legally unsustainable.
- Moreover, the Committee observed that to verify all infrastructural, instructional, and other facilities, the NCTE had invited Performance Appraisal Report from all recognized institutions for the academic session 2021-22 and 2022-23. However, the institution has failed to submit the Performance Appraisal Report for the academic session 2021-22 and 2022-23, which were the mandatory requirements to assess the availability of instructional and infrastructural facilities of the institution as per NCTE Rules and Regulations.

**In view of the above, the SRC decided to file a Counter Affidavit on the points mentioned above.**

Further, the SRC considered the directions of the Hon'ble High Court on the matter in its 492<sup>nd</sup> meeting held on 24.03.2026 and the Committee decided to issue a Show Cause Notice to the institution on the following grounds:

1. Explanation on admitting students in D.El.Ed. course during 2018-2019 on their own without adhering the Rules and Regulations stipulated by the State Govt. of Andhra Pradesh.
2. Latest approved faculty list duly approved by the Competent Authority of SCERT, Andhra Pradesh is required to be submitted for granting Restoration Order for re-starting the D.El.Ed. programme.
3. Copy of updated FDRs of Rs.7 & 5 Lakhs (Being Reserve and Endowment Fund) along with Form 'A' in original is required.
4. Website of the institution as per the provisions of NCTE Regulation (Norms & Standards), 2014 are required to be updated.

<p>In view of the above, the Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the institution to submit its reply/representation on the above grounds within 21 days from the date of issue of this Show Cause Notice.</p>
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The meeting ended with the vote of thanks to the Chair.
