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The Committee has taken up the following agenda items in its 512th Meeting.

1.	Saketh College of Elementary Education, No. 3-79, K.No. 68/1, Main Road, Gavaravaram Village and Post, Koyyalagudem Mandal Taluk & City, West Godavari District – 534312, Andhra Pradesh. File No.: - SRCAPP762, SRCAPP2806, Programme: - D.El.Ed., D.El.Ed.-Addl The original file of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Regulations, Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were placed before the Committee and the SRC after careful consideration made the following observations: - 1. A letter No. RC. No. 359/A/SCERT/2019 dated 29.06.2020 was received from the Commissioner, School Education (FAC), School Education Department, Govt. of Andhra Pradesh on 17.07.2020 recommending therein for de-recognition order in respect of 188 Pvt. D.El.Ed Colleges in A.P. on the grounds that the said managements of Pvt. D.El.Ed Colleges have made admission into the D.El.Ed Course during academic year 2018-19 on their own in violation of Government orders. 2. The matter of the institution in hand was considered by SRC in its 386th meeting held on 23rd-24th July, 2020 and decided to issue Show Cause Notice. Accordingly, as per the decision of SRC, Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution on 29.09.2020. The institution has not submitted reply to the Show Cause Notice. The SRC in its 397th Meeting held on 25th & 26th March, 2021 considered the matter and decided to withdraw the recognition. Accordingly, as per the decision of SRC, Withdrawal Order was issued to the institution on 13.04.2021. 3. Also, on the basis of the complaints from the State Govt. recognition of the 378 institution was withdrawn vide order dated 05.10.2021 following the procedures. 68 institutions including certain no. of institutions from the list of 378 approached to the Hon'ble Court of Andhra Pradesh at Amravati for relief against the common
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withdrawal order dated 05.10.2021. The institution in hand was not in list of 378 institutions, and its withdrawal was not issued by the common withdrawal order dated 05.10.2021. Its recognition order was issued separately by order dated 13.04.2021.

4. The judgement of the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh dated 29.03.2022 in respect of the writ petition (c) no. 7002/2022.

stating as under:-

*6. "In that view of the matter, the order **dated 05.10.2021** passed by respondent no. 3 is hereby set aside. Respondent no. 3 may initiate proceedings by issuing fresh Show Cause Notice to all the petitioners-colleges through email as well as registered post with acknowledgement due within a period of three weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order if he is so advised. On receipt of such Show Cause Notice, the petitioners-colleges are directed to offer their explanations within a period of four weeks thereafter and on such explanations, if any, being offered by the petitioners-colleges, respondent no. 3 is directed to pass appropriate orders in accordance with law, within a period of four weeks thereafter and communicate the same to the petitioner.*

7. The writ petitions are allowed accordingly, pending miscellaneous applications, if any, shall stand closed in consequence. No costs."

5. It is evident from the above order that the withdrawal in respect the institution in hand has not been set aside however, since the institution was petitioner in the aforesaid petition, show cause notice was sent to the institution along with other 67 institutions dated 16.01.2023.

6. Further, as per decision of SRC, a common Final Show Cause Notice dated 20.02.2023 was issued to 57 institutions including this institution as out of 68 institutions, only eleven institutions had submitted the reply.

7. The SRC in its 422nd Meeting held on 02nd – 03rd March, 2023 considered the matter and decided to withdraw the recognition of the institution along with other 56 institutions. Accordingly, as per the decision of SRC, a common withdrawal order No. F.SRC/NCTE/57/D.El.Ed/AP/2023/141531 dated 27.03.2023 was issued to the institution along with the other 56 institutions.

8. Further, the institution alongwith other 14 institutions approached to the Hon'ble Court vide W.P (C) No. 16353/2025 and the Hon'ble High Court has directed vide order dated 12.11.2025 as follows: -

"Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that a common show cause notice, dated 16.01.2023 was issued to 68 institutions. Out of 68 institutions, only one institution submitted reply for the said show cause notice and again, a final show cause notice was issued to 57 institutions. Out of total 68 institutions, only 11 institutions submitted reply to Show Cause Notice & Final Show Cause Notice.

However, it is the case of the petitioners herein that no such notices were received by them. It is

	<i>further contended that deficiencies, if any, noticed in one institution cannot be attributed to other. In such circumstances, issuance of impugned proceedings would speak volumes.</i> <i>In view of the aforesaid facts and circumstances, balance to conveniences is in favour of the petitioners. There shall be interim suspension of order, vide, F.SRC/NCTE/57/D.El.Ed/AP/2023/141531 dated 27.03.2023 issued by 3rd respondent.</i> <i>List the matter after eight (8) weeks for filling of counter-affidavit by the respondents.”</i> 9. Again, the institution filed a Writ petition no. WP 7000 of 2026 before the Hon’ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh at Amaravathi. The interest of SRC-NCTE was duly defended by filing a Counter-Affidavit dated 11.06.2026 before the Hon’ble Court. The matter was disposed of vide final Court order dated 13.07.2026 whereby the Hon’ble High Court directed as under: <i>“6. Having regard to the submission made, the impugned show cause notice dated 16-01-2023 is set aside and the matter is remanded to the respondent No.5 for consideration afresh. The petitioner is also at liberty to file an explanation to the show cause notice, dated 16-01-2023 to the respondent No.5 within a period of three (03) weeks from the date of receipt of the order. Upon filing of such an explanation to the show cause notice, the respondent No.5 is directed to pass appropriate orders within a period of four (04) weeks thereafter.</i> <i>7. With the above observation, the Writ Petition is disposed of.</i> <i>There shall be no order as to costs.”</i> The Committee examined the matter afresh in compliance of the direction of the Hon’ble Court considering the above facts and circumstances and in view of the above, Committee unanimously concluded that the recognition of the institution was no more before the show cause notice dated 16.01.2023 was issued to the institution. Further, the Hon’ble Court has also set aside the show cause notice dated 16.01.2023 which was issued to the institution as it was a party in the writ petition (c) no. 7002/2022. Accordingly, the Committee decided that no action is required in respect of the institution of which recognition has already been withdrawn.

Sri Rajeswari College of Education, S.No.-467/3 and 474/3, 29/152-E-14A, SBI Colony, Nandyal, Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh File No.: - APS07529, Programme: - B.Ed. <u>Decision:</u> The original file of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Regulations, Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were placed before the Committee and the SRC after careful consideration made the following observations: - 1. The VT members has remarked in the VT report that the documents were not uploaded on the portal whereas the same were examined and uploaded on the portal. It may be due to technical error.

	In view of the above, the Committee decided that Show Cause Notice be issued under section 14/15 of the NCTE Act, 1993 to the institution to submit reply within 21 days from the date of issue of the Show Cause Notice on the above deficiencies.
3.	Sri Pulloji Rao College of Education, D.No. 21/452-Z-70, Bypass Road, Opp. Venkateswara Theatre, Nandyal, Kurnool-518501, Andhra Pradesh. File No.: - APSO7420, Programme: - B.Ed. <u>Decision:</u> The original file of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Regulations, Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were placed before the Committee and the SRC after careful consideration made the following observations: - 1. The inspection was conducted on 12.08.2026 and VTR has been received on 12.08.2026. Considering the VT report and other related documents, SRC decided to change the premises from D.No. 21/452-Z-70, Bypass Road, Opp. Venkateswara Theatre, Nandyal, Kurnool-518501, Andhra Pradesh to Sy. No. 645/2, 646, 647/1, Giddalur Village, Giddalur Mandal, Prakasam District, Andhra Pradesh – 523357.
4.	Muslim College of Education Kalkulam, Nagercoil, Kanyakumari, Tamil Nadu-629174 File No.: - 2526202402271794, Programme: - B.A. B.Ed. Secondary(1Unit) B.Sc. B.Ed. Secondary (1 Unit) The online file of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Regulations, Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were placed before the Committee and the SRC after careful consideration made the following observations: - 1. Final SCN post Lol was issued on 03.08.2026. 2. The institution has furnished the reply on 04.08.2026. 3. The institution had applied for B.A. B.Ed. Secondary(1Unit) and B.Sc. B.Ed. Secondary (1 Unit), however, the faculty is sufficient for only one unit for either B.A. B.Ed. Secondary or B.Sc. B.Ed. Secondary as there is shortage of one language faculty. In view of the above, the SRC decided to send a communication to the institution to give their choice for either B.A. B.Ed. Secondary or B.Sc. B.Ed. Secondary within 7 days from the issuance of the communication in this

	regard.
5.	Kongunadu Integrated College of Education, Marukkalampatty, Velagoundampatti, Namakkal, Tamil Nadu – 637212 File No.: - 2526202402211536, Programme: - B.A. B.Ed. Secondary (1 unit) & B.Sc. B.Ed. Secondary (1 unit) The online file of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Regulations, Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were placed before the Committee and the SRC after careful consideration made the following observations: - 1. LoI was issued on 30.06.2026. 2. The institution has furnished the reply on 17.08.2026. After carefully observing the reply LoI uploaded by the Institution along with other related documents, the SRC decided that the Institution be granted recognition under regulation 7(16) of NCTE Regulations 2014 for B.A. B.Ed. In obedience to the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Madras vide its order in W.P. No. 35222/2025 dated 15.09.2025, the opportunity was given to the institution to come physically for personal hearing before the SRC Committee. 2. The nominee of Bill Gates College of Education, Villupuram Distt, Tamilnadu i.e. Dr. G. Sathish Kumar, Administrative Officer, was personally present before SRC on 10.11.2025 at 12.30 PM. 3. The SRC interacted with the nominee of the institution. The Nominee was asked to present the facts supported with the relevant documents, in support of their claim to SRC office. 4. The SRC noted that Hon'ble High Court of Madras vide its order in W.P. No. 29187/2022 dated 14.11.2022 has permitted the institution to participate in the Counselling only for the academic session 2022-2023.

	5. Based on the oral information given by the nominee of the institution it is learnt that the admissions have been done beyond the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Madras for the academic year 2023-2024 and 2024-2025. 6. SRC decided that the office of the SRC should go through all the documents submitted by the nominee of the institution vis-à-vis the records of SRC and place the matter before SRC in its ensuing meeting for consideration by SRC. • The SRC in its 479th meeting held on 09th – 10th December, 2025 considered the matter and decided as under:- 7. <i>As per direction on the Hon'ble High Court of Madras vide order dated 03.11.2022 the institution was allowed to participate in counselling and admit students for the academic session 2022-2023.</i> 8. <i>Thereafter, no further direction was received from any of the Judicial Authorities and/or Semi Judicial Authorities to allow the institution to admit the students for the upcoming sessions 2023-24 and 2024-25.</i> 9. <i>In view of the above, the SRC decided that a letter be written to the Registrar, TamilNadu Teacher Education University, TamilNadu seeking the present affiliation status and details of admitted students and thereafter details of their examination and final action taken report/outcome on the admitted students for the session 2023-24 and 2024-25 within 21 days from the date of issue of Show Cause Notice</i> • <i>Accordingly, a communication was issued to the Registrar, TamilNadu Teacher Education University, TamilNadu vide letter dated 01.01.2026. (ii) Aggrieved by the decision of refusal, the institution approached to the Appeal Committee and the Appeal Committee vide its order dated 16.06.2026 communicated as below: <i>After careful consideration of the Appeal Report, the impugned order, the records available on file, and the submissions made by the appellant institution, the Appeal Committee of the Council, in exercise of its appellate jurisdiction under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993, hereby sets aside the impugned order dated 14.01.2026 and remands the matter to the Southern Regional Committee (SRC) for fresh consideration and factual re-examination, strictly in accordance with the provisions of the NCTE Act, 1993, the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014 (as amended), and the NCTE MDI Guidelines dated 15.05.2025, subject to the directions contained hereinabove. The appellant institution shall submit the requisite documents within fifteen (15) days, whereupon the Regional Committee shall proceed in accordance with law and pass a reasoned and speaking order within a reasonable timeframe.</i> (iii) The institution submitted the documents vide letter dated 29.06.2026. In view of the above and considering the documents submitted by the institution, the Committee decided that Show Cause Notice be issued under section 14/15 of the NCTE Act, 1993 to the institution to submit reply within 15 days from the date of issue of the Show Cause Notice on the following deficiencies. (i) There is shortage of two language faculty in terms of requirement under NCTE norms and regulations. (ii) There is no faculty for career guidance and counselling. (iii) The faculty list has not been verified by the Registrar of the University concerned. (iv) Designation/rank of the HoD has not been mentioned.

SCN post inspection was issued to the institution u/s 14/15 of NCTE for Shifting of Premises vide letter dated 14.08.2026. 2. The institution has submitted reply of Show Cause Notice vide their letter dated

	15.08.2026 along with documents received in this office on 19.08.2026. Considering the VT report and other related documents, SRC decided to change the premises from Plot/Khasara No. 926, Plot No. 926, Main Road, Koilkunta Village and Post Office, Koilkunta Taluka And City, Kurnool District – 518134, Andhra Pradesh to Survey no. 132/2, 132/3, Bestavaripeta village, Bestavaripeta Mandal, Prakasam District, Andhra Pradesh-523334.
9.	North Karnataka D.Ed college, Hulsoor Road, Basavakalyan, Bidar District, Karnataka File No.: - APSO5905, Programme: - D.El.Ed The original file of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Regulations, Appeal order No. 89-104/E-360687/2025 Appeal/12th (Emergent) Meeting, 2026 Appeal No.APPLSRC202514987 dated 05.08.2026, Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were placed before the Committee and the SRC after careful consideration made the following observations: - (i) The institution was granted recognition for Elementary (D.El.Ed.) course of two years duration with an annual intake of 50 students vide order dated 12.04.2007. The recognition of the institution for D.El.Ed. programme was withdrawn by the SRC vide order dated 27.01.2023. (ii) The institution preferred an appeal and The Appeal Committee considered in its 8th Meeting, 2025 held on 04.07.2025, wherein the withdrawal order dated 27.01.2023 issued by the Southern Regional Committee (SRC) was upheld. (iii) The appellant institution thereafter challenged the said appellate order before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in W.P.(C) No. 2759/2026. The Hon'ble High Court, vide order dated 03.08.2026, directed the Appellate Authority to consider the documents produced by the appellant institution and pass a speaking order within two days. This remand shall not be construed as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case, which are left open for determination by the Southern Regional Committee in accordance with law.</i> (v) The institution has submitted all the relevant documents vide their letter no. N.K.D.El.Ed. College/BKL/2026-27 dt. 06.08.2026. Considering the above facts and circumstances and documents submitted by the institution and the fact that the matter has been remanded back by the Appeal Committee setting aside the withdrawal order, the SRC decided to restore the recognition granted to the institution vide recognition order dated 12.04.2007 with annual intakes of 50 students.

The original file of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Regulations, Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were placed before the Committee and the SRC after careful consideration made the following observations: - (i) The recognition of the institution was withdrawn by SRC vide order No. NCTE/2025/SRC/PAR/ORDER/AOSO0281 dated 17.05.2025 on the grounds of non-submission of PAR for the Academic Session 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 respectively. (ii) Aggrieved by the order of the SRC, the institution preferred an Appeal before the Appellate Authority of the NCTE. The Appellate Authority vide order No. 89-256/E-370983/2025 Appeal/Emergent Meeting, 2026 Appeal No. APPLSRC202515174/E-89261 dated 16.01.2026 taken the following decision: <i>"Afet perusal of the Appeal Report, documents on record, and oral arguments advance during the online hearing, hearing the Appeal committee of the council concluded that the instant appeal of the appellant institution has become infructuous and is disposed accordingly, strictly in accordance with the directions contained hereinabove, the applicable law, and the binding decision of the General Body of the Council."</i> In view of the above, the Committee decided to note the decision of the Appeal Committee.

(i) Consequent upon the decision taken by the Southern Regional Committee, the application submitted by the institution was refused under clause 14/15(3)(b) of NCTE Act, 1993 vide refusal order dated 29.12.2025.

(ii) The institution filed a writ petition no. 42647 of 2025 titled "Sri Rangapoopathi College of Arts Science and Education vs NCTE" with the following prayer:

i. "Issue a writ of certiorari mandamus under Article 226 of the Constitution of India calling for records of the first respondent relating to the Guidelines for Transforming NCTE Recognized Stand-Alone Teacher Education Institutions into Multidisciplinary Higher Education Institutions- May 2025 and the consequential notice of the second respondent in F.No. NCTE/SRC/ 2627202509233112 /TamilNadu/2025 SCN dated 17-10-2025 quash the same and direct the second respondent process the application of petitioner without insisting upon the production of the documents set out in the above notice dated 17-10-2025 and

ii. pending the disposal of the Writ Petition grant an order stay of all further proceedings pursuant to the impugned notice of the second respondent in F.No. NCTE/SRC/2627202509233112 / Tamilnadu / 2025/ SCN dated 17-10-2025 pending disposal of the writ petition and

iii. dispense with the production of the original of the impugned orders namely the Guidelines for Transforming NCTE recognised Stand-Alone Teacher Education Institutions into Multidisciplinary Higher Education Institutions- May 2025 and the consequential notice of the second respondent in F.No. NCTE/SRC/ 2672202509233112 / Tamil Nadu/ 2025/ SCn dated 17-10-2025 forever and thus render justice

(iii) A counter-affidavit has been filed in the matter to defend the Guidelines for Transforming NCTE Recognized Stand-Alone Teacher Education Institutions into Multidisciplinary Higher Education Institutions- May 2025 and to further defend the matter in favour of the SRC/NCTE.

(iv) The matter was listed before the Hon'ble Court and the Court vide its order dated 13.08.2026 passed following directions:

" 2. In reply, the learned counsel appearing for the respondent would submit that now, only the notice dated 17.10.2025 was issued to the petitioner, for which, he can very well file his detailed reply. Further, he would submit that if any reply is filed, the same will be considered and appropriate orders will be passed in accordance with law. However, without filing any such reply, the petitioner had approached this Court vide the present petition in a pre-mature manner. Hence, he prays for dismissal of this petition.

3. On the other hand, the learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner had already filed his reply, however, the same was not at all considered by the respondents till date.

4. In view of the above, this Court directs the petitioner to file a copy of his reply before the concerned Authority within a period of 4 weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order. In such case, the respondent shall consider the same and after affording an opportunity of

	<i>personal hearing, appropriate orders shall be passed within a period of 4 weeks from the date of receipt of reply."</i> (v) The office of SRC has received a representation dated 17.08.2026 from the Institution. Vide the said representation the institution has submitted the copy of reply dated 14.11.2025 as per the directions of the Hon'ble High Court and requested SRC to comply the court order dated 13.08.2026. In view of the above the Committee decided to afford an opportunity of personal hearing to the institution. Accordingly, a communication may be made to the institution via email to appear before the Committee in its next meeting either through online mode or offline mode.
12. The original file of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Regulations, Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were placed before the Committee and the SRC after careful consideration made the following observations: - (i) The SRC in its 413th Meeting held on 22nd & 23rd August, 2022 had considered the matter and decided to issue Show Cause Notice to the Institution. Accordingly, as per the decision of SRC, Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution dated 07.03.2024. The institution did not submit any reply to a Show Cause Notice. (ii) The SRC in its 438th Meeting held on 03rd June, 2024 considered the matter and decided to issue Final Show Cause Notice. Accordingly, as per the decision of SRC, Final Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution dated 21.06.2024. The institution did not submit any reply to a Final Show Cause Notice. (iii) No PAR filled by the institution for the year 2021-2022 and 2022-2023. The recognition of the institution was withdrawn by SRC vide order No. NCTE/2025/SRC/PAR/ORDER/B.Ed/ dated 05.06.2025 on the grounds of non-submission of PAR for the Academic Session 2021-2022 and 2022-2023. (iv) The institution filed a Writ Petition no. W.P.(C)11449/2026 before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi. The Hon'ble High Court vide its order dated 11.08.2026 passed the following directions: <i>"8. In view of the above, issue notice.</i> <i>9. Mr. Anuj Kapoor, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the respondents, accepts notice. He submits that the present petition ought not to be entertained for the reason that there is a statutory remedy available in terms of Section 18 of the NCTE Act, against the order of</i>

	<i>withdrawal of recognition.</i> <i>10. List on 23.09.2026."</i> Keeping in view the above, the SRC decided as under: A communication may be issued to the concerned State, Affiliating Body/University and Counselling Authority to the effect that the operation of the impugned withdrawal order no. NCTE/2025/SRC/PAR/ORDER/B.Ed/ dated 05.06.2025 has been stayed by Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and that the institution is permitted to participate in the counselling and admit students for the academic session 2026-27. This communication should also be uploaded on the NCTE website.

After promulgation of the NCTE Regulations, 2014, the institution consented to come under the purview of the said Regulations and submitted a notarized affidavit dated 22.01.2015 to this effect. 2. Thereafter, the Southern Regional Committee (NCTE), vide Revised Provisional

Recognition Order dated 06.05.2015, granted revised recognition to the institution, subject to fulfilment of the conditions stipulated therein, for conducting the following programme:

3. Subsequently, a corrigendum was issued vide Order No F.SRO/NCTE/APS00008/B.Ed/AP/2015/68581 dated 29.06.2015, whereby the approved intake was corrected from two units to one unit.

4. The matter relating to compliance by the institutions with the conditions stipulated in the revised Recognition Order was placed before the Southern Regional Committee in its 369th Meeting held on 28.01.2019. The Committee decided that Show Cause Notices be issued to all such institutions which had failed to submit the requisite compliance. Accordingly, a Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution on 04.02.2019.

5. In response to the aforesaid Show Cause Notice, the institution submitted its reply vide letter dated 22.02.2019.

6. On ground of the following deficiencies, final Show Cause Notice was issued on 12.04.2022.

1. The institution is required to submit certified copy of land documents issued by concerned Tehsildar /Revenue Officer. (If the same are in Regional Language the institution is also required to submit notarized copy of English version of land documents).
2. The institution is required to submit an attested/notarized copy of the approved Building Plan (if institution is running more than one Teacher Education programme, it shall be required to submit an exclusive earmarked building plan for each of the recognized Teacher Education programme).
3. The institution is required to submit an attested/notarized copy of site plan showing all the plot/Survey No. mentioned in the land documents in one location along with land area and built up area.
4. *The institution is required to submit Staff list duly approved by the Registrar of the affiliating body as per the prescribed Format, attached at **Annexure-2**. (In case the institution is running more than one teacher education programme, it is required to submit staff list duly approved by the Affiliating body for each of the recognised teacher education programme being run by the Institution.)*
5. The institution has submitted FORM “A” issued by branch manager in which FDR No. 238110 Rs. 7 lakhs are matured.
6. The institution is required to submit the bank statement of all faculty

showing disbursement of salary through bank account as required under NCTE Regulations, 2014.

7. The institution shall be required to submit an Affidavit clearly stating status about land & building and Management (Society/Trust) at the time of recognition and its present status giving following details
 - (i) Details of land & building available at the time of recognition with the Institution
 - (ii) Details of land & building now available with the Institution
 - (iii) Status of Management at the time of recognition and its present status

In case of change of land & building or the Management at the time of recognition and thereafter the institution is required to specify the reason thereof with approval of the SRC, NCTE.

The institution shall note that in case, where the institution is conducting more than one Teacher Education Programme, detail of (i) total built up area available in a composite manner showing the same in duly earmarked building plan for each of the teacher education programme (ii) latest faculty list duly approved by the affiliating body (iii) FDRs respectively provided for additional programmes is required to be submitted indicating the intake for each programme.

7. The institution did not reply against the final show cause notice dated 12.04.2022.

8. Further, the recognition of the institution for B.Ed. Course was withdrawn by the Southern Regional Committee vide Order No. NCTE/2025/SRC/PAR/ORDER/APSO0008/ dated 02.06.2025 (hereinafter referred to as the "Withdrawal Order"), on the stated ground of non-submission of the mandatory Performance Appraisal Report (PAR) within the stipulated timeline. Similarly, the recognition of the institution for M.Ed. Course was withdrawn by the Southern Regional Committee vide Order No. NCTE/2025/SRC/PAR/ORDER/SRCAPP2314/ dated 02.06.2025 (hereinafter referred to as the "Withdrawal Order"), on the stated ground of non-submission of the mandatory PAR within the stipulated timeline.

9. Subsequently, in light of the Hon'ble Court's direction dated 15.12.2025, the recognition of the institution was restored for both the courses in Jan., 2026.

10. The institution submitted an application dated 24.03.2026 seeking permission for shifting/change of premises, along with the requisite supporting documents.

11. Subsequently, the institution filed W.P.(C) No. 11842/2026 before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and the order of the Hon'ble Court dated 17.08.2026 is as under:-

1. This is a writ petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking the

following prayers:-

“a) issue a Writ of Mandamus thereby directing the Respondent No.2 to forthwith process the Petitioner’s application dated 16.03.2026 submitted seeking permission for shifting of premises, to cause inspection of the new premises of the Petitioner institution and to decide Petitioners said pending application, in a time bound manner; and/or...”

2. For the reasons stated in the petition, issue notice.

3. Mr. Nanda, learned counsel accepts notice on behalf of the respondents.

4. Since the prayer in the petition is only to direct the respondents to decide the applications of the petitioner institutes for shifting of premises, in a time bound manner, it is directed that the respondents shall conduct an inspection within 2 weeks from today, and decide the application of the petitioner within 2 weeks thereafter.

5. The petition is disposed of in the aforesaid terms.

In view of the above, the Committee is of the unanimous view that the compliance in respect of the RPRO is still persisting and change of the name of the institution and change of the premises of the institution should be decided after the compliance is made by the institution in respect of the RPRO. However, honouring the direction of the Hon’ble Court, the Committee scrutinized the application meant for the change of the name of the institution and change of the premises of the institution and found certain deficiencies. Accordingly, the Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued mentioning two categories of deficiencies i.e. (i) deficiencies that were communicated vide final show cause notice dated 12.04.2022 and (ii) deficiencies related to new proposed premises and new proposed name of the institution to the institution to submit its reply within 21 days from issuance of the Show Cause Notice.

Deficiencies under category I:- As mentioned under para 6 (supra).

Deficiencies under category II:-

1. The institution is required to submit the certified copy of the mutation certificate along with duly notarized its English version, if the same is in regional language. The certificate must indicate the same khasara/plot/khata/survey/gata number, etc. as have been mentioned in the Sale Deed/Gift Deed/transaction deed.
2. The institution is required to submit Fire Safety Certificate establishing that safeguard against fire hazard has been provided in all parts of the building. If the same is in regional language, duly notarised its english-version is required.
3. The institution is required to submit Building Safety Certificate indicating that the building of the institution has been constructed as per National Building Code and the same is fully safe and structurally sound having load bearing capacity as per the code/standards, to run the teacher training course.
4. The institution is required to submit a Barrier Free/Accessible Certificate establishing that the institution campus, building, furniture, etc. are barrier

	free/accessible. - The institution is required to submit the copy of the Resolution passed by the Trust/Society for the change of the name of the institution and for the change of the premises of the institution. - The institution is required to submit Building Completion Certificate (BCC) in the prescribed proforma, duly approved by the competent authority along with duly notarized its English version, if the same is in regional language. The format of BCC is attached at Annexure-1 of the minutes. - The institution is required to submit an affidavit on Rs. 100/- non-judicial stamp paper, duly sworn/attested by the competent authority, in the English language, affirming that the contents of the representation/resolution and all documents submitted in support thereof, including the land-related documents, Fire Safety Certificate and other relevant documents, are true, correct, genuine and duly authenticated. LC/SRC is also directed to apprise the Hon'ble High Court of the status of the case accordingly within the time-limit.
14.	Sanjeeva Reddy College of Physical Education, Perumantra Post, West Godavari – 534124, Andhra Pradesh File No.: - APSO5767, APSO7405, Programme: - B.P.Ed., U.G.D.P.Ed. The original file of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Regulations, shifting application alongwith the relevant documents, Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were placed before the Committee and the SRC after careful consideration made the following observations: - - The Southern Regional Committee (NCTE), in its 486th Meeting held on 04.02.2026, considered the matter and decided to issue a Continuation Order dated 10.02.2026 in respect of the B.P.Ed. and D.P.Ed. programmes of the Institution. - Subsequently, the institution submitted an application dated 02.04.2026 seeking permission for shifting of its premises, which was received in the Southern Regional Office on 15.04.2026. - In connection with the aforesaid application for shifting of premises, the institution filed W.P. No. 11932/2026 before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi. seeking, inter alia, the following relief: - The matter was listed before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi on 18.08.2026. Sh. Rupal, Standing Counsel, Delhi High Court, vide email dated 18.08.2026, has intimated the outcome of the hearing as under: <i>"Dear Sir,</i> <i>The captioned matter was listed yesterday for hearing.</i>

The Hon'ble Court, in view of the limited prayer sought by the Petitioner-College, has directed that inspection shall be conducted within 2 weeks from today of the proposed new premises of the college and the application of the Petitioner-College for shifting of premises shall be decided within the 2 weeks thereafter.

The matter stands disposed of.

This is for your kind information and necessary action."

5. The aforesaid order of the Hon'ble High Court has not yet been uploaded on the official website of the High Court of Delhi.

In view of the above and after examination of the application along with the relevant documents, the Committee decided to issue Show Cause Notice to the institution on the following grounds to submit its reply within 21 days from issuance of the Show Cause Notice.

1. The institution is required to submit Re-validation Demand Draft No. 000143 dated 12.02.2026 of Rs 1,77,000/- only shifting of premises.
2. The institution is required to submit the certified copy of the mutation certificate along with duly notarized its English version, if the same is in regional language. The certificate must indicate the same khasara/plot/khata/survey/gata number, etc. as have been mentioned in the Sale Deed/Gift Deed/transaction deed.
3. The institution is required to submit Fire Safety Certificate establishing that safeguard against fire hazard has been provided in all parts of the building. If the same is in regional language, duly notarised its English-version is required.
4. The institution is required to submit Building Safety Certificate indicating that the building of the institution has been constructed as per National Building Code and the same is fully safe and structurally sound having load bearing capacity as per the code/standards, to run the teacher training course.
5. The institution is required to submit a Barrier Free/Accessible Certificate establishing that the institution campus, building, furniture, etc. are barrier free/accessible.

The original file of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Regulations, Appeal Order, Hon'ble Court's order, Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were placed before the Committee and the SRC after careful consideration made the following observations: - 1. Withdrawal Order No. F.SRC/NCTE/SRCAPP681/D.El.Ed./{AP}/2022/139567-139571 was issued to the institution on 24.01.2023. The Appeal committee confirmed the order vide appeal order dated 16.09.2025. 2. Aggrieved by the aforesaid Withdrawal Order, the institution approached the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh by filing W.P. No. 30978 of 2025. The Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh passed an order/judgment dated 10.03.2026 in the said writ petition and set aside the appeal order dated 16.09.2025 and further directed the Appellate Authority to examine the appeal of the petitioner on merit. 3. Thereafter, an Appeal Order No. 89-160/E-366530/2025 Appeal/10th Meeting, 2026 APPLSRC202515042/E-90482 dated 27.07.2026 was passed, whereby the matter was remanded to the Southern Regional Committee for fresh consideration. The relevant portion of the decision of the Appeal Committee is reproduced below: <i>"After careful consideration of the Appeal Report, the impugned withdrawal order dated 24.01.2023 passed by the Southern Regional Committee, the judgment dated 10.03.2026 of the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh in W.P. No.30978 of 2025, the records available on file, the documents placed on record, and the submissions advanced by the appellant institution, the Appeal Committee of the Council, in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 18 of the National Council for Teacher Education Act, 1993, sets aside the impugned order dated 24.01.2023 and remands the matter to the Southern Regional Committee for limited factual verification and fresh consideration, strictly in accordance with the observations and directions contained herein and in conformity with the provisions of the NCTE Act, 1993, the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014 (as amended), and the applicable norms, guidelines and decisions of the Council."</i> <i>"The Southern Regional Committee shall complete the aforesaid exercise expeditiously and pass a reasoned and speaking order, after affording due opportunity of hearing to the appellant institution, without being influenced by any observation contained in this appellate</i>

	<i>order except to the extent of the directions issued herein. This remand shall not be construed as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case, which are left open for determination by the Southern Regional Committee in accordance with law.”</i> 4. In compliance with the aforesaid appellate decision, the institution has submitted its reply dated 03.08.2026, which was received in the Southern Regional Office on 14.08.2026, along with supporting documents. Considering the above facts and circumstances, decided to restore the recognition of the institution granted vide recognition order no. F. SRO/SRCAPP681/D.El.Ed/AP/2015/62125 dated 03.03.2015 and also issue Show Cause Notice be issued to the institution on the following grounds to submit its reply within 21 days from issuance of the Show Cause Notice. <i>1. The institution is required to submit an attested/notarised copy of the approved Building Plan (if institution is running more than one Teacher Education programme, it shall be required to submit an exclusive earmarked building plan for each of the recognised Teacher Education programme).</i> <i>2. The institution is required to submit a “Form A” issued by the respective Bank Manger towards creation of FDR of Rs.7 lakh and 5 lakh, totalling Rs.12 lakh towards Endowment Fund & Reserve Fund into joint account for a duration of 5 years alongwith a copy of the FDRs.</i> <u>Table-Agenda</u>
16.	Residential College of Education, Patan Post, Pattan Taluk, Gulbarga District, Karnataka. File No.: - APSO1886, Programme: - B.Ed. The original file of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act 1993, Regulations, Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time were placed before the Committee and the SRC after careful consideration made the following observations: - - The recognition accorded to Shri Gurushantappa Jawali Memorial Trust Residential College of Education, Pattan Post, Pattan Taluk, Gulbarga District, Karnataka, for conducting the B.Ed. programme (APSO1886), was withdrawn vide Withdrawal Order dated 05.01.2018. - Aggrieved by the aforesaid Withdrawal Order, the institution filed W.P.(C) No. 5097/2026 before the Hon’ble High Court of Delhi, seeking, inter alia, the following reliefs: “(a) pass an appropriate order, direction or writ in the nature of certiorari or any other appropriate writ seeking quashing of the impugned order dated 05.01.2018 passed by the Respondent No.2, whereby the Respondent No.2 has withdrawn the recognition of petitioner institution;

(b) pass an appropriate order, direction or writ in the nature of mandamus or any other appropriate writ directing the Respondents to re-consider the case of petitioner and restore the recognition dated 03.01.2006 of the Petitioner institute for conducting B.Ed. course with an annual intake of 50 students from the academic session 2026-27 and all subsequent academic sessions, in the facts and circumstances of the present case and in the interest of justice;

(c) pass an appropriate order, direction or writ in the nature of mandamus or any other appropriate writ directing the respondent no.2 to decide the representation dated 11.09.2024 of the petitioner institution expeditiously;

(d) Pass an appropriate order, direction to Respondent No.2 to consequently update its website by displaying the recognized status of the Petitioner institution as a recognized institution on its website and to intimate it to its affiliating university; and

(e) Pass such other further order(s) as this Hon'ble Court may deem fit and proper in the facts and circumstances of the present case."

3. The Hon'ble High Court, vide order dated 21.07.2026, directed as under:

"4. In view of the statement of Mr. Rupal, learned counsel for the respondent, the respondents shall consider and decide the representation dated 11.09.2024 along with the documents of the petitioner, expeditiously and not later than 4 weeks from today.

5. The petition is disposed of in the aforesaid terms."

4. The representation dated 11.09.2024 has been submitted by the institution to the Southern Regional Committee after an inordinate delay of approximately six years from the date of the Withdrawal Order. The institution did not avail the statutory remedy of filing an appeal before the competent Appeal Committee under Section 18 of the National Council for Teacher Education Act, 1993, against the said Withdrawal Order.

5. The Committee thoroughly examined the representation dated 11.09.2024 and found that the following major documents have not been attached with the representation dated 11.09.2024:

(i) Faculty list with approval of the Registrar of the concerned Affiliating Body.

(ii) The bank statement stating that faculty are being paid regularly through RTGS/cheque or other online mode since their appointment.

(iii) Attested/notarised copy of Building Completion Certificate issued by the competent authority.

(iv) Latest Fire Safety certificate issued by Competent Authority.

(v) Building safety certificate issued by the Competent Authority.

(vi) Certificate issued by the Revenue Department regarding existence of building of the institution.

	(vii) Domain name of the website being run by the institution. (viii) Copy of the "Form A" issued by the respective Bank Manager towards creation of FDRs of Rs.7 lakh and 5 lakh, totalling Rs.12 lakh towards Endowment Fund & Reserve Fund into joint account for a duration of 5 years alongwith a copy of the FDRs. (ix) The building plan approved by the competent authority. In view of the foregoing, the Committee concluded that the institution has not exhausted the statutory remedy available to it, namely, an appeal before the Appeal Committee against the withdrawal order dated 05.01.2018. Accordingly, the Committee decided that obeying the Hon'ble High Court's order to consider the case, a communication be issued to the institution advising it to approach the competent Appeal Committee for consideration of its grievance, <i>inter alia</i>, by submitting the aforesaid documents, in accordance with the provisions of the NCTE Act, 1993 and the applicable Rules and Regulations.
